Business Briefs OTTAWA (CP) - Production of steel ingots in the week ended Sept. 19 amounted to 181,000 tons, an increase of 22.8 per cent from the preceding week.

OTTAWA (CP) - Canadian railway operating revenues increased 16.2 per cent in April compared to April, 1963. Operating expenses rose 9.8 per cent to \$100,150,000, resulting in a net profit of \$77,000,000 compared to \$1,061,000 of a year ago.

OTTAWA (CP) - Landings of sea fish and shellfish by fishermen in Newfoundland and the Maritime provinces increased 24.3 per cent in August, 1964, over the same month in 1963.

OTTAWA (CP) - For-hire air service in Canada in the last three months of 1963 carried an estimated 52,471,000 passengers, or 10 per cent from the fourth quarter of 1962.
