France-U.S. Co-operation May Increase

PARIS (Reuters)—French officials have indicated that a new rapport in Franco-American co-operation is on the horizon after it was announced Foreign Minister Couve de Murville will visit Washington.

His visit begins Feb. 17 and will last nearly a week. The French foreign minister will hold extensive talks with U.S. State Secretary Rusk.

French officials said the talks "may inaugurate a new period of confident co-operation between Washington and Paris."

The fact that the news was announced by the French was seen by American diplomats here as a good sign, indicating hopes of a constructive meeting.

Franco-American relations recently were strained over the U.S. proposal for a NATO multilateral nuclear force, opposed by France.

However, relations were thought in French and American diplomatic circles to have improved greatly since December when Rusk had talks here with President de Gaulle.

De Murville, whose visit is at Rusk's invitation, was expected to deal with bringing NATO into line with modern developments.
