TORONTO (CP)—Two Toronto men earlier feared drowned while sailing from Canada to England in a small ketch are believed to be alive. The mother of one of them received a message from her son's wife in England saying the men were sighted by a passing freighter.

Mrs. May Smith said the letter from her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Violet Smith, told of Bert Smith and Allan Battersby being sighted by the freighter Marabonker. The ship left the men provisions and sent a cablegram to Violet Smith from her husband. The cablegram said: "Dis-masted making port on short sail SS Marabonker left enough provisions. Love."

350 Head Of Cattle Will Be Offered At N. B. Feeder Sale

MONCTON, N.B. — Designed to encourage the development of the cattle feeding industry in New Brunswick, with attendant emphasis on higher beef production, the second annual stock and feeder cattle sale will be held at the C.N.R. cattle sheds here on Tuesday, October 16, starting at 1:00 p.m.

Approximately 350 head of cattle will be offered for sale by farmers in the area. The sale is sponsored by the N.B. Department of Agriculture and by the Federations of Agriculture of Kent, Westmorland and Albert Counties. The idea was first introduced last year and proved an outstanding success, and Provincial Minister of Agriculture C.B. Sherwood has said that similar sales may be arranged at other centres in the province if it is found that a surplus of cattle makes them feasible.

As a means of developing the beef raising industry, the sale aids farmers in providing an outlet for feeder type cattle and makes such cattle available in uniform lots at a central marketing point. Values of cattle are established by quality and by the supply and demand factor in such an open sale and opportunity is given to market lightweight cattle as feeders rather than as animals for slaughter at low grade and prices. C.N.R. has made arrangements to have cattle cars available at Moncton so that farmers may ship their purchases directly from the sale, says John E. McIntyre C.N.R. Agricultural agent for the Atlantic Region. Secretary of the sale is H.E. Keller of the Department of Agriculture in Fredericton.
