

Fish Landings Are Heavy At Souris

SOURIS — Fish landings at Souris by the dragger fleet have been heavy in the last few days. The draggers put to sea after the storm kicked up by Hurricane Daisy passed over and the catches have been good since.

The first heavy landings were made Oct. 16 and the fish processing plants at Souris have been busy night and day looking after the landings.

Most of the fish landed here has been flounder with smaller quantities of cod and hake, but no haddock.

Dragger captains say it's unusual to get large catches so late in the fishing season and without having to cruise to specific grounds. Most of the catches have been made in the Gulf of St. Lawrence not far from the home port.

Pre-School Testing Program Need Is Outlined At Souris

SOURIS — "I am convinced of the necessity of a pre-school testing program in this province," asserted John MacDonald, regional teacher with the department of health, Division of Mental Health, when speaking in Souris recently.

"It," continued Mr. MacDonald, "a teacher know a child's limitations then the teacher could accept this child as he is, rather than forcing him to a point where he is over his head."

Many of our classes are operated on a competitive basis and a child can readily see, said the speaker, "that a six-year old with a mental age of seven is not at all competitive for another six-year old with a mental age of five."

"Moreover," he stated, "research has proven to us that the slow learner has no place in a regular classroom." Still pursuing this line of thought Mr. MacDonald stated that this is not enough to separate these children but we must go further and provide the necessary educational adjustments to make progress if possible. Menon, frequent champion of Red China, also vowed that India will "light on, come what may, and the accession is inevitable."

Speculation that Russia might intervene diplomatically with the Red China arose after Prime Minister Nehru met Saturday for half an hour with Soviet Ambassador A. Benediktov. Russia agreed several weeks ago to deliver MIG fighters to India.

BACK ON JOB

Mr. S. Ambassador John Galbraith, who went to London Saturday intending to stay a week, has returned to Ottawa today explaining "this is not a good time to be off the job."

The Red Chinese were pressing attacks 900 miles apart in the disputed highlands of the Himalayas where winter already has set in, with heavy snowfall.

The Indians, at the end of extremely rugged supply lines that depend on air drops and human pack trains, already had been driven out of six or seven defence posts and still were retreating.

Observers said the Chinese appeared to be getting themselves well entrenched in the widely separated border areas before winter intensifies to the point where military operations are impossible.

The fighting is concentrated on two fronts about 1,000 miles apart on the border with China. The eastern front is in the area called "McMahon Line" which India claims is the border. The western front where the Chinese claim about 36,000 square miles below the "McMahon Line" which India claims is the border.

The battle started at dawn Saturday, by Indians account, when the Chinese in the strength of a division or more, opened up with heavy mortars, medium machine-guns and burp guns on positions north of the Nam Kha, called the Kechiling by the Chinese.

The Indians said the Chinese attacked from fortified positions on Thak in Ridge which India claims is the border.

The Indian press reacted excitedly to the fighting and the dependent Hindustan Times ran the headline: "India is at war."

In an editorial, The Times says: "for all that it is unclear, it is a war and it will

Souris Sells Bond Issue

SOURIS — The Joint tender of F. J. Brennan and Co., and Gardner and Company for the sale of Town of Souris bonds was accepted. The tender was for \$225,000 worth of bonds at the rate of \$98 per 100 of debenture at five and three-quarter per cent.

The bonds will be used to repay a bank loan which was used for installing water and sewerage.

The motion to accept the tender was made by Coun. Henry Larter, and seconded by Coun. Allan MacLean.

The special meeting of the council, held Friday night, also decided to make a application for the Winter Works program for completion of installations for water and sewerage in homes and for streets and sidewalk work.

Work on this latter is already underway.

SOURIS — Souris was blacked out for about 30 minutes last evening when a power line independent of the S. N. A. Standard system was damaged by a storm surge.

The statement came as China issued a "most urgent, most serious, and strongest protest" with the Indian Embassy here against "frenzied attacks" by aggressive Indian troops.

The note said Chinese guards had been compelled to strike back against attacks prepared "over a long time" and "the Indian government must accept responsibility for all the serious consequences arising therefrom."

Chinese newspapers are also devoting their entire front pages to reports of the fighting, protest notes and foreign reactions.
