

Birthday Anniversary Of Noted Island Clergyman

Congratulations are being extended today to Rev. A. D. MacKenzie, D.D., (right), on the occasion of his 78th birthday. Dr. MacKenzie is living quietly in retirement at his home on McGill Avenue, City.

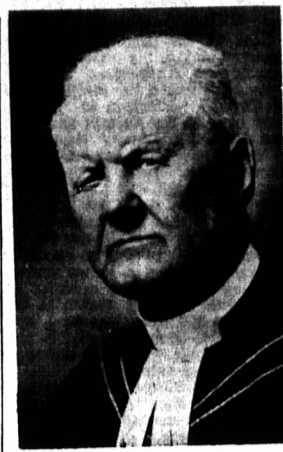
In 1946, Dr. MacKenzie observed his 40th anniversary in the Christian ministry by preaching his farewell sermon at Sydney, N.S., where a Saint Andrew's Church, he was ordained in 1906. On his retirement he was the veteran preacher's wish that he give at least five years of his ministry to his native province. He actually served seven years, three of which were spent at Monague United Church. MacKenzie fell at Montague which stands as a monument to the work he accomplished while there.

Dr. MacKenzie was born in Hartsville, P.E.I., in 1878. He attended school in his local community after which he spent a year at Prince of Wales College, P.W.C. He went on to McGill University where in 1904 he graduated as a gold medalist and was sent to Glasgow University, Scotland, on a fellowship. He received the Doctor of Divinity degree from Saint Andrew's Theological College in Saskatoon.

Following his return from Scotland, Dr. MacKenzie served for five years as a missionary in British Columbia where he contracted malaria and yellow fever which caused him to withdraw from that field of service. The effects of the fever affected his health for the rest of his life. Two years ago he was the victim of a stroke from which he has made a remarkable recovery.

An outstanding linguist, Dr. MacKenzie is a master of the Gaelic and while serving in the Glengary district of Ontario, he often conducted his service in the Highland tongue. He also preached in the Hindi language and can speak German fluently.

From Ontario, Dr. MacKenzie went to Saint Luke's Church at Notre Dame de Grace in Montreal, where he will long be remembered for his outstanding work among the young people of that area. His next pastorate was Saint John's Church in Vancouver, after which he preached for a year at Knox Church, Regina.



Before returning to Regina as minister of Westminster Church, he taught for a number of years at Stanstead College in the Province of Quebec. His leadership at Westminster lasted for 16 years. Dr. MacKenzie always had a deep concern for the spiritual welfare of the far north and for two years his retirement from the active ministry, he was the driving force in establishing a radio service for those in the outpost districts. Dr. MacKenzie was first married to Miss Annie MacMillan of Sydney, N.S. She died some years ago and from this union there are two daughters, Mrs. Miles Gordon, Montreal, and Mrs. J. C. Arnell, Ottawa. His second marriage was to Miss Alma Motherwell, a daughter of the late Hon. W. R. Motherwell, former Federal Minister of Agriculture. They have a son Donald, living in Ottawa.

Dr. MacKenzie's fine scholastic attainments, together with a warm personality and an evangelistic fervor, mark him as an one who has made an outstanding contribution to the spiritual life, not only of his native Province, but to the whole of Canada. His many friends will join in extending to him many happy returns.
