Day Of Hansard Reporter May Be Coming To An End

CAPITAL BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN - OTTAWA - The day of the Hansard reporter in the House of Commons may soon be over.

Debate in the Commons is now recorded for posterity by a corps of shorthand experts who occupy two double desks on the floor of the house - one for English and one for French.

The answer may lie in extensive changes currently being made to the Commons' chamber in preparation for the 54th inter-parliamentary conference to be held here in September.

The sessions, to be attended by about 1,200 delegates from 75 countries, will be conducted in five languages: English, French, Russian, Spanish and Japanese.

Simultaneous translation from any one language into the other four is to be made possible by changes in the sound system.

Four language channels are being added to the two now in existence and a total of 644 new six-language outlets will be installed in the chamber and the galleries.

Some 40 miles of additional wiring is being laid to handle the expansion.

AMC Reports Sharp Drop In Earnings

DETROIT (AP) - American Motors Corporation reported Monday a sharp drop in net earnings for the first nine months of its fiscal year.

The dividend, payable Sept. 20 to stockholders of record Aug. 20, will be 12 1/2 cents a share.

The company said net earnings for the period from last Oct. 1 to June 30 were \$18,240,926, compared with \$25,884,034 for the nine-month period a year earlier.

Net sales for the current nine months were \$762,160,528, off from the \$816,287,450 of last year.

The decline in AMC sales and profits was in sharp contrast to reports from the automotive big three - General Motors, Ford and Chrysler - of whom reported record earnings.

American Motors chairman Richard Cross and president Roy Abernathy said third-quarter figures showed a decline in per-share earnings to 37 cents this year from 39 last year.

The April 1 to June 30 period resulted in net sales this year of \$239,955,839 and net earnings of \$6,932,850.

Last year, the figures were net sales of \$264,756,211 and net earnings of \$7,417,943.

Nickel Co. Earnings Set Record

NEW YORK (CP) - International Nickel Co. of Canada Ltd. announced Monday that earnings for the first six months of the second quarter of 1965 were the highest for any six periods in the company's history.

Inc. directors, meeting here, increased the quarterly dividend on common shares to 70 cents a share from the previous 62 1/2-cent rate.

The increased dividend is payable Sept. 20 to shareholders of record Aug. 23.

Henry Wingate, Inc. board chairman, said earnings during the first six months of 1965 were \$75,846,000, equivalent to \$2.56 a common share.

For the first half of 1964, earnings were \$70,921,000, or \$2.40 a share, and for the second half they were \$64,847,000, or \$2.19 a share.

During the second quarter of 1965, earnings were \$38,566,000, or \$1.28 a share, compared with \$36,065,000, or \$1.22, for the second quarter of 1964.
