

Ball Seeks To Ease Greek Fear

CP from AP-Reuters arrived in Greece Wednesday on a mission to ease tension and war scares straining relations between Turkey and Greece.

The undersecretary of state flew from Geneva, where he had been attending the world trade conference, for consultations with the two estranged Atlantic Alliance allies.

Ball conferred with Premier George Papandreu and arranged to meet Turkish Premier Ismet Inonu in Ankara today.

The undersecretary explained before leaving Geneva that his mission was not intended as a mediation effort.

"This problem can be solved only by the parties directly involved," he said. "Any solution will require a great deal of realism and generosity on all sides."

"It is utterly impossible for war to break out between the two North Atlantic Treaty partners because of the serious consequences this would have for the whole free world."

TAKE SHARP MEASURES
Informed sources said he carried word that the United States is ready to take sharp measures to prevent conflict over the Mediterranean island from degenerating into a Greek-Turkish war or otherwise disrupting NATO's eastern flank. The nature of such measures was not specified.

In advance of Ball's arrival, Turkey denied Greek-Cypriot allegations that it plans military intervention in Cyprus. A foreign office spokesman in Ankara said the Turks have taken only normal security precautions.

These precautions including periodic massing of warships and troops in southern Turkish waters have set off repeated invasion scares among Greek-Cypriots, and delight among Turkish-Cypriots.

The Turkish spokesman said charges by President Makarios Tuesday that Turkey violated the island's air space and supplied arms and ammunition to Turkish-Cypriots are "just another Greek political maneuver."

In Nicotia, however, a UN official said the threat of a Turkish invasion "obviously affecting the peace of the island."

CONCERNED OVER ARMS
Gale Plaza Lasso, a special representative of Secretary-General U Thant, led a press conference the United Nations also is "concerned over the growing inventory of arms."

The Greek-Cypriot minister of commerce and industry, Andreas Araozos, led Nicotia for Moscow with a message from Makarios for Premier Khrushchev. A government source said Araozos will discuss with Soviet officials the coming Security Council debate on extending the service of the UN peace force, whose original mandate expires June 27.

Elsewhere on the island, the situation remained tense. A small bomb pushed through a grill exploded inside the RAF club in Limassol in the southwest. There were no casualties.

Tuesday night a gun duel raged for 75 minutes between Greek and Turkish-Cypriot positions west of Saint Hilarion Castle in the Kyrenia Range.

Minister Queried On French Plans For Quebec Plant

OTTAWA (CP)—Finance Minister Gordon said in the Commons he hasn't received any specific proposals from French automobile manufacturers concerning tariff concessions they might want in connection with establishing plants in Quebec.

Leon Baler (PC—Trois-Rivieres) had asked whether the government had made any decision on the matter. Mr. Gordon said that when proposals are received they will be given sympathetic consideration.

Gilles Gresoire (Creditiste—Lapointe) asked whether the French firms would get the same concessions as given to the Volvo Company at Dartmouth, N.S. There was no reply.

INVADE BEATLES' SUITE
HONG KONG (Reuters)—Squealing teen-agers invaded the Beatles 420-a-day suite at a Hong Kong hotel Wednesday night and grabbed everything from the coffee to old socks as souvenirs. They surged up to the 15th floor of the Presidential Hotel after the group had left for Sydney, rolled on the beds and kissed the pillows where they thought the Beatles slept.

ERHARD LAYS WREATH
OTTAWA (CP)—Chancellor Ludwig Erhard of West Germany stood in silent meditation Wednesday before Canada's National War Memorial to some 100,000 Canadians killed mainly in two wars against his country.

He placed a wreath of red carnations and yellow mums at the foot of the memorial and then stood alone silently as the band of the Canadian Guards played *Abide With Me*.
