## Summerside Man Fined For Assault

SUMMERSIDE — On a charge of assaulting Kline Souter of Summerside, Aubin Luce of Summerside was fined \$30 and costs when he appeared before Magistrate R.S. Hinton, QC, in town police court yesterday.

Ronald Joseph Gaudet, Summerside, changed his plea to guilty on a charge of driving a motor vehicle while his license was suspended. Neil R. MacLeod appeared on behalf of the accused.

Charles of failing to supply police with information and one of speeding were withdrawn, with the sentences to cover these charges under the one charge of driving while suspended.

He was fined \$100 and \$3.50 costs, or alternatively, to serve 30 days in Prince County Jail. The first charge was laid October 20, and a subsequent charge was laid October 31, was treated as a first offense, since it was so close to the laying of the original charge.
