Contract Bridge

NO RULE IS IRONCLAD

Theoretically, a major-suit contract should be preferred to three notrump when each partner has four cards in the major. That this, however, is not a "guaranteed" rule is attested by the following hand, among others.

East dealer. Both sides vulnerable

♠	K 6 4 2	♠	A 10 8
♥	7 2	♥	J 6
♦	A K 8 4	♦	Q 10 6 3
♣	A 7	♣	10 9 5 4

Deal:
 ♠ 9 3
 ♥ A Q 9 5
 ♦ 2
 ♣ Q 8 3 2

Deal:
 ♠ Q J 7 5
 ♥ K 10 8:
 ♦ J 5
 ♣ K J 6

This deal, taken from a team-of-four contest, was bid quite differently at the two tables. At Table 1, the sequence was:

East	South	West	North
Pass	Pass	Pass	1♦
Pass	3♦	Pass	1♠
Pass	Pass	Pass	4♣

East opened a club. Declarer (North) won and led trump to the jack, then returned with the ace and shifted to hearts. West continued the suit, and East's spade ten over-ruffed declarer for the setting trick.

At the other table, South took a different view of the matter:

East	South	West	North
Pass	Pass	Pass	1♦
Pass	2NT	Pass	3NT
Pass	Pass	Pass	Pass

West opened his fourth-highest heart. East put up the jack and was permitted to hold the trick. The heart six was covered by the eight and taken by West with the nine, but now West's hand was virtually dead. Not wanting to give declarer a heart trick, West shifted to spades. East won and returned the suit. Declarer took this trick in dummy and led a low diamond toward his jack. Whether East put up the queen or ducked, declarer was assured of four diamond tricks, and since he had three spades as sure winners, he did not need either a heart trick or the club finesse!

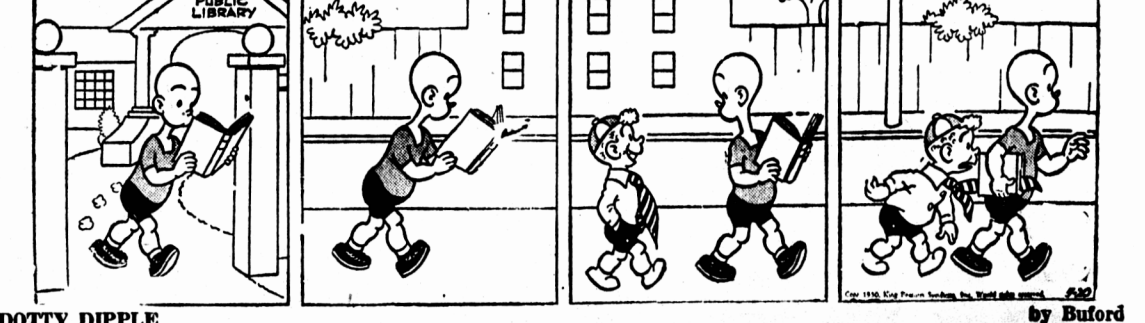
