ward with Falconbridge rising 1/4
at 26 1/2 and Hudson Bay gained
1/4 at 49. Algonquin Uranium was up
1/4 at 12 1/2 on a few trades.
Hollinger was the standout
among olds, ahead 1 1/4 at 29 1/2.
Kerr-Addison added 1/4 at 19 1/4
and McIntyre closed unchanged
at 82, recovering from an early
1-2 point loss.
