CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

You are the dealer, both sides vulnerable and have opened One Club. Partner responds One Diamond. What would you bid now with each of the following four hands?

1. ♠AQ ♣KJ5 ♠9862 ♠QJ94
2. ♠AKT ♠98 ♠QJ75 ♠AQ983
3. ♠AJ ♠AQ7 ♠Q8 ♠KQJ762
4. ♠AQ95 ♠4 ♠K78 ♠AKQJ2

One notrump. It is rare not to raise partner at once when you have four-card trump support, but in this case it is better to suppress a raise in favor of the more illuminating rebid of one notrump.

The notrump bid tells partner that you started with minimum values and a balanced hand, which is certainly the case here. A two diamond bid would suggest distributional values—for example, a singleton spade or heart—and would be more forward-going. The rebid of one notrump draws a far better picture of the actual values held.

Two Three diamonds. Here we have very good support for diamonds and, furthermore, values well above a minimum opening bid. Both features are very well expressed by a double raise of partner's suit. The jump raise is not forcing and partner is permitted to pass if he barely scraped up his original response. In such case, there is probably no game in the cards.

An alternative rebid of one spade is also available—to an enterprising player. There is considerable merit to such a call—since the all-around shape of the hand can be better described when a jump raise in diamonds is given later—but it is always dangerous to bid a three-card major suit, since partner may be caught unawares and run wild. However, in a well-developed partnership, a spade bid may turn out to be best.

Crash Blamed On Lightning

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government has listed lightning as the cause of an airliner crash.

The finding was announced in a report by the Civil Aeronautics Board on the crash of a Pan American World Airways plane near Elton, Md., Dec. 8, 1963. Eighty-one persons were killed.

Lightning ignited the mixture of fuel and air in the No. 1 reserve fuel tank at the top of the left wing of the Boeing 707-121, the board said. The result was an "explosive disintegration of the left outer wing and loss of control."

Prairie Farmers To Visit Quebec

OTTAWA (CP) — A 35-man delegation from the National Farmers' Union left last night for two days of talks with Quebec farmers and businessmen in Montreal.

President Roy Atkinson said the visit will be the first time an organized group of Western farmers has visited Quebec, and he hopes to discover the "changes and problems in Quebec" during talks with Montreal-area farmers and businessmen and tours of industrial plants.

He said their schedule did not permit time to see provincial officials in Quebec City, but thought they would be too busy, anyway, with the legislature in session there.

START CRUCIAL TALKS

SALISBURY (Reuters) — Commonwealth Secretary Arthur Bottomley Wednesday began crucial talks with Prime Minister Ian Smith and his Rhodesian government. Bottomley planned to leave for London after a 10-day visit aimed at easing the deadlock over the future independence of this self-governing colony.
