Plot Tipoff Caused Tight Security Guard On Reds

By LEONARD LEDDINGTON LONDON (AP) — A band of European anti-Communists drew lots one night to choose the man for the job to shake the world—the assassination in London of the ganin and Nikita Khrushchev, Lonsvisiting Soviet leaders Nikolai Buldun newspapers reported Saturday.

High British officials confirmed that word of an assassination plot had reached Scotland Yard and set off frantic security measures taken during the tense 10-day stay London newspapers, with Bulgagan and Khrushchev now safely en route home, gave the plot reports prominent play with varied details but with an unanimous high relief.

Even the most far-fetched and melodramatic of the tips reaching Scotland Yard were checked. In addition to the usual bomb-from-the-roof and poison-in-the-pudding reports, there were some more intricate and detailed—such as the plot to mine the River Thames out side London. The mines were supposed to be placed in the path of a boat bringing the Soviet leaders on a visit to Greenwich.

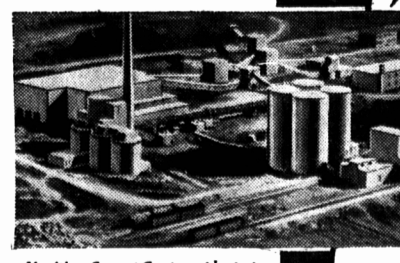
