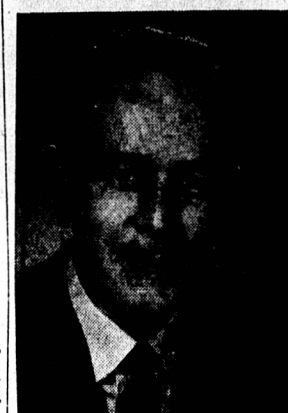

Nutrition Program As Part Of Health Service Being Organized In PEI

OTTAWA, Jan. 10. - Prince Edward Island is developing an organized nutrition program as part of its Provincial public health service with the support of a Federal health grant according to an announcement by Hon. Paul Martin, Minister of National Health and Welfare.

The need for a nutrition program is emphasized, Mr. Martin said, by a recent survey conducted in a large number of rural schools. This study, which checks with reports from a dental survey and from individual doctors, indicates that many children are not receiving nutritionally adequate meals as outlined in "Canada's Food Rules."

Active Year At Vocational School
