To the Honorable the HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY in their Legislative capacity at this time convened.

We, the undersigned inhabitants of Rustico and vicinity beg leave to call your attention to the fact, that the use of Trawls or Sett lines on the north side of this Island has increased to such an extent as is likely to prove extremely ruinous to one of our most important branches of industry—the Cod Fisheries.

Your petitioners have every reason to believe that if the present practice of Sett line fishing is continued, a few years more will see the utter extinction of the Codfish on our shores, as has been the result, from the same cause, in some of the best fishing grounds in the North American waters.

We trust, therefore, that your Honorable House will take such measures as may be deemed best for the better protection of this great interest, which is yearly becoming of more and more importance to the Inhabitants of Prince Edward Island.

And your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray
