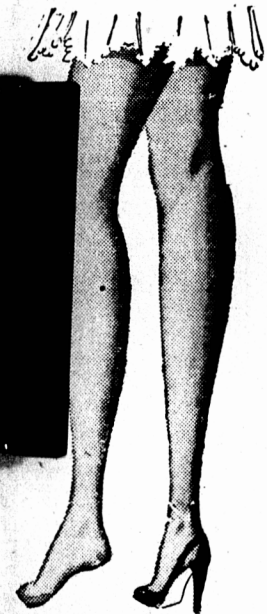
Happenings of The Week

Cook's Corner

- SALMON CROQUETTES 1 cup very thick white sauce Dash cayenne 1 cup chopped celery 2 eggs, separated 2 cups (1 lb.) canned Salmon 2 cups fine dry bread crumbs. Sauce 4 tablespoons butter 5 tablespoons flour 1 cup milk 1 cayenne Celery Beaten egg yolks Flake Salmon and add sauce. Chill thoroughly. Mold into six-one shaped croquettes, roll in crumbs, then in slightly beaten egg whites, again in crumbs. Fry in deep fat about 3 minutes, until golden brown. Drain and serve with tartar sauce in a green pepper shell, and lemon wedges. Serves 6.

That Body Of Yours

"Like malignant growth elsewhere, cancer of the lip is a grave disease. It is carried to lymph nodes near by and will eventually kill the patient unless it is treated adequately and at an early stage.

CANCER OF THE LIP

Dr. Burckell presents a review of some 534 cases of cancer of the lip treated in Saskatoon Cancer Clinics at Regina and Saskatoon. 97 per cent of which were on the lower lip. In one group of 131 cases the cancers had been present from 9 months to as long as 20 years, the average being about 4 years.
