Strange But True

In the third year after the inception of the idea, nearly 50,000 persons met to dedicate the cairn built of stones from both sides of the border and to repeat the vow printed thereon:

"TO GOD IN HIS GLORY"
We the two nations dedicate this garden and pledge ourselves that as long as men shall live we will not take up arms against one another.
