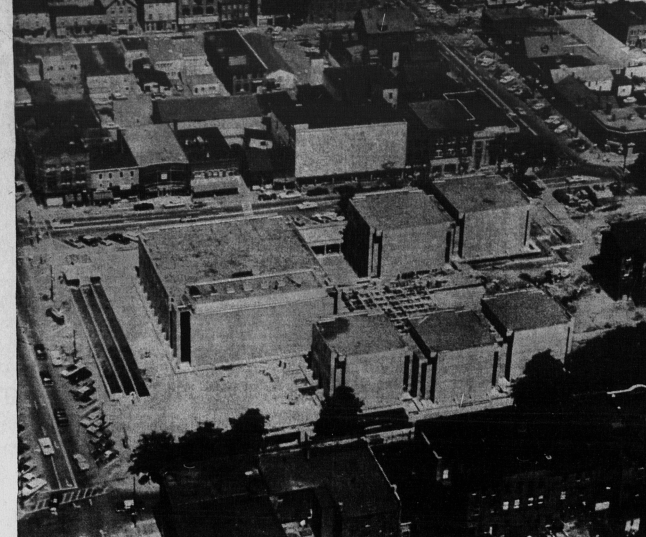

A lot of American reporters are getting religion these days when they want to go to the States. It's a sort of religion many knew about only vaguely. It's that old time religion that is, apparently, good even for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

Covering this group (which is headed by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.) invariably leads reporters inside the Deep South's Negro churches. It can be quite an experience. Within the dingy walls of the clapboard churches, as the Negroes call them, is a side of U.S. culture almost totally unknown to the spill-side visitor.
