Two men with serious leg injuries were dropped at Belfast and taken to hospital.

Bank President Sees No Need For Pessimism In '54

TORONTO, (CP)—B. S. Vanstone, president of the Bank of Toronto, said Wednesday there is no need for pessimism concerning 1954 if business directs its policy to a curtailment of costs, with sound and aggressive merchandising.

Nevertheless, he said in an address to the bank's annual meeting, the year will be one of intensive competition and interesting challenges, and he saw "partial justification" for the views of both optimists and pessimists.

Return To Normal

Instead of recent downward trends in some lines of business indicating recession, "is this not merely an indication that North America, after years of artificially-stimulated sellers' markets, is striving to return to the normal condition of a buyers' market?"

William Kerr, general manager, said value will be under constant scrutiny, "but this is as it should be and is not something that need give concern to good merchandising."

"There is little need to fear what lies ahead in 1954 for those businesses whose policies are founded on industry, intelligence and integrity."

Mr. Vanstone said recent additions to Canada's known natural resources should in time, enhance the standard of living.

Rich Promises

"New Brunswick, northern Quebec, northern Ontario and the territories now give promise of additional reserves of copper, lead, zinc, iron and nickel; and they give indications of tin and manganese heretofore available only from abroad and important supplies of uranium and of the newest wonder metal, columbium."

"Discoveries of former years have been brought close to production. Saskatchewan's north country has begun producing uranium. From the new mines at Lynn Lake, Man., first copper ore has begun to roll towards Alberta."

"New open pits, supplied with power by submarine cables under the St. Lawrence, will soon produce copper in Gaape; and the new railway should be ready next summer to bring iron ore from Labrador."

Sees Danger In Bank Loans For Construction

MONTREAL, (CP)—Edouard Labelle, president of the Provincial Bank of Canada, in an address released Saturday sounded a warning against effects of a government plan to permit banks to extend mortgage loans for new construction.

Long-term loans are apt to stimulate an economy similar to that during the Second World War, with a subsequent rise in the cost of living, he said in his address to shareholders.

"There was no question about the ultimate aim but there are dangers which should result from the means now being proposed to achieve it."

Mr. Labelle, who spoke Jan. 13 at the 53rd annual general meeting of shareholders, said there will be many readjustments in 1954 which will require "our best judgment and cool-headedness" and that although promises of the future are based on the country's natural resources, these do not necessarily guarantee unceasing progress in economic development.

"At present time, the statements of banks show that these institutions would find it difficult to make mortgage loans on a large scale without assistance from the central bank Bank of Canada. More than that, such loans are possible only in terms of an increase in deposits, which...play in our economy a role equivalent to money."

"This addition to the means of payment, without the volume of goods for current consumption being necessarily increased to the same extent, is apt to stimulate an inflationary process."

With hostilities in Korea ended, hopes for a resultant increase in goods available for consumption "cannot be realized unless reconversion is successfully carried out."

"This in turn depends on whether conditions will be favorable to new investments, and on what will be the reaction of consumers. Moreover, a country like Canada, depending on its own foreign markets, more particularly on the American market, is at the mercy of external circumstances completely beyond our control."

OH Sufficiency

"Already more than half-way to self-sufficiency in oil, we may attain it altogether in the next few years. The prodigious engineering achievements at Kitimat, B. C., will soon begin producing aluminum for ourselves and for export."
