### Contracting Out Is Viewed As Important Step

**MONTREAL (CP)** — Contracting-out was viewed by Toronto professor Dr. J. Stefan Dupre here as an important step toward "maintaining the integrity of Canadian federalism."

"Confederation is far more likely to contain the province of Quebec through the use of contracting-out provisions than it is to lose Quebec as a result of such provisions," he said.

Dr. Dupre, from the department of political economy at the University of Toronto, was speaking at a panel meeting at the annual conference of the Canadian Tax Foundation.

Dr. Dupre said some believe that the new contracting-out arrangements, sought especially by Quebec, are only a prelude to a great day of judgment "whereby Quebec will contract its way out of Confederation altogether."

"Let me say that I personally find this view untenable," Dr. Dupre envisaged a "multi-faceted federalism" that would pose many challenges for governments.

"While I cannot bring myself to doubt our latent capacity to meet these or other challenges in the next few years, I do pray that this capacity will be allowed to express itself and not be stifled by ill will and bed of panic and misgovernment."
