



HIS LIFE NORMAL NOW

Patrick Griffen, four, son of Mr. and Mrs. Emmett Griffin, Elmsdale, had an unfortunate accident in the Summer of 1963. He went too close to a hay baler on his father's farm and was drawn into the machine, resulting in amputation of the left leg approximately four inches from the hip joint. Following initial treatment at the Prince County Hospital, he

was admitted to the Rehabilitation Centre for further treatment including intensive physiotherapy in preparation for fitting with an artificial limb. Easter Seal funds covered transportation costs on two occasions to and from the Rehabilitation Institute of Montreal, where Patrick was fitted with his artificial limb, making it possible for him to enjoy a normal life.

23 Cases On Docket At Alberton Court

ALBERTON — Twenty-three cases were on the docket in court at Alberton yesterday afternoon with Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald, presiding.

Ernie Blanchard MacDonald, Coleman, Desmond Thomas Edward, Glengarry, and Herbie Ashley, Cascumper, received fines of \$10 and costs each for driving without due care and attention.

James Everett Powers, Alberton South, charged with driving without a license, squealing tires and failing to stop when signalled to do so by a police officer, had all three charges adjourned to April 14.

Keith Thomas Mallett, Elmsdale, was fined \$10 and costs for operating an unregistered vehicle without a valid license.

TWO CHARGES

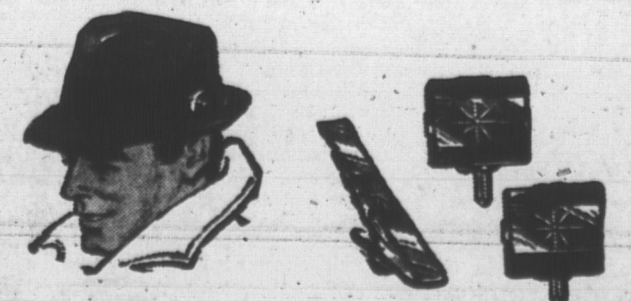
