

Basketball...

The Fieldhouse was the scene of two exciting Alumni basketball matches last Friday night, October 11. The Lady Pathers met the women's Alumni first, in two, twenty-minute periods. Seconds into the first period, the old Lady Pathers got the first basket, thanks to Janet Nicholls, then Heather Campbell got two points for the current team shortly after. The Lady Pathers fought well against the strong Alumni during the first match; but, the "old Ladies" proved that they knew how to play great basketball by leading 40-22. In the second period, the Lady Pathers picked up their game slightly by defending their court and receiving points; yet, the Alumni exhausted the team with its fast performance. The result: Alumni, 68; Lady Pathers, 39.

of this game, the score was 10-10. It was an impressive night, nonetheless. A moderate-sized crowd attended the games, and it will be nice to see larger crowds when the basketball season begins in a few weeks.

Youth Dies

A fifteen year old youth is dead following a fatal traffic accident in Charlottetown on Friday, October 11. Fifteen year old Micheal Scott Miller of Southport was struck by a car while walking along University Avenue just outside the university gates.

Forty-one year old Gary McGregor of Winsloe has been charged with impaired driving following the accident. The off duty RCMP officer was driving an unmarked patrol car at the time of the accident. Mr. McGregor is to appear in court on November 6th.

The stretch of roadway where the accident occurred has been the target of repeated complaints from the Student Union in recent years. The president of the university stated, following the accident, that a sidewalk was needed along the roadway and that there would be meeting on the subject in the near future.
