Anniversary Service Slated For Tignish United Church

TIGNISH — An anniversary service will be held in Tignish United Church Sunday afternoon at 2:30 p.m. when Rev. C. B. Webber, Summerside will be guest minister for the occasion. Special music will be provided by the Wilmet quartet of Fredericton, N.B., directed by Frank Pridham. The quartet is well known for its gospel singing throughout the Maritimes. Mrs. Eric Sheen of Summerside will be guest organist. Historical records of the Protestant church in Tignish dates back a 101 years. The first church building was located a mile from the present one near Tignish shore. Rev. Robert Dyer, the first Anglican clergyman to be settled in West Prince County, tells in his journal that at Tignish a church was built by the Episcopalians, Baptists, Presbyterians, and Methodists, and that he himself had the pleasure of opening the new church. The year would be either 1860 or 1861.

The present church was erected 60 years ago. The new minister for the congregation is the Rev. David MacDonald formerly of Charlottetown.

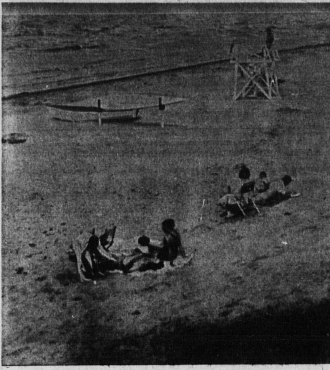
