

Red Wings & Black Hawks Make Large Player Deal

DETROIT (CP) — The trade winds blew heavily Tuesday on the Detroit Red Wings and Chicago Black Hawks as eight National Hockey League players switched teams.

Wingers Nick Mickoski, Bob Bailey and Jack McIntyre and center Eric Lalonde will move to Chicago to take up positions with Wings, who sent Earl Reibel, Dave Latta, Larry Ferguson and Billy Dea and center Wally Burt to Chicago.

The trade is the 10th between the two clubs since the summer of 1950. Their last big deal occurred last summer when Hawks acquired John Wilson, Forbes Kenney, Hank Bassen, Bill Preston

Unveil Statue To U. S. Airman

WASHINGTON (AP)—A statue of one of the U. S. Army's most controversial figures, the late Brig. Gen. Billy Mitchell, was unveiled Tuesday.

Retired Gen. Carl Spaatz said of the man who was suspended from rank and command 32 years ago:

"He was a man of action. He risked a court martial to rouse a sleeping nation to air power."

It was a simple ceremony in the aeronautics hall of the Smithsonian Institution on the 44th anniversary of the first powered flight by man. It was Dec. 17, 1903 that Wilbur and Orville Wright lifted their plane at Kitty Hawk, N.C.

William Mitchell Jr., son of the United States man who argued that the United States was steeped in old methods instead of going all-out for air power, drew a parachute off the larger-than-life statue.

The Mitchell case still is unsettled. An air force review board held a hearing last May and is reported to have recommended reversal of the conviction. But no action has yet been taken.

Mitchell, born in 1879, became a pilot at the age of 36. Flying over the German lines from France during the First World War convinced him that air power was a mighty weapon of the future. It was in France that story about one of official channels that led to his court martial.

Use Flying Gas Stations

WASHINGTON (AP) — Flying gas stations today are the key to what military men have called the most crucial single element in a national defence.

For all practical purposes, they make limitless the range which bombers can fly.

The gas stations are four-engine monsters of the air known as KC-97 strato-tankers. More than 800 of them are in service at U.S. bases around the world, providing a pipeline in the sky to supply B-47 and B-52 bombers.

WIDENS RANGE

The successful development of in-flight refueling means that should foreign bases be knocked out, attacks still can be mounted from the U.S.

Once every five minutes around the clock a flight of B-47s or B-52s jockey into position behind flying gas stations while en route to complete a simulated attack or returning to a home base still several thousands of miles away.

A flying gas boom is guided from the plexiglass cockpit in the belly of the tanker just forward of the tail section.

FLEXIBLE ARM

The boom is a slightly flexible metal arm, about 23 feet long and eight-inches in diameter. It extends below the tanker just up and can be moved up and down and to each side within a limited area. Two tankers are located near the end of the boom and enable the tanker crew to fly it into position much as an aircraft is steered.

The boom hovers over the jet's nose, then is quickly dropped into the open gas receiver.

About 600 gallons of fuel a minute can be pumped to the jet.
