Despite the French attacks, the rebels continued doggedly digging foxholes and trenches in the shadow of the bastion's barbed wire defences.

OSHAWA, Ont.—In line with advanced merchandising trends in the rapidly expanding automobile industry, General Motors Products of Canada has divided the functions of its Advertising and Sales Promotion Departments, according to an announcement released today by E. J. Umphrey, Vice President and Director of Sales. E. W. "Gene" Irwin, who has headed both departments at Oshawa for some years, now takes charge of Sales Promotion as a full-time activity, while the post of Advertising Manager is assumed by A. P. "Bert" Morrow, formerly Assistant Sales Promotion Manager. "With the continuing progress of the Canadian automotive industry," said Mr. Umphrey in making the announcement, "there must be more and more emphasis on specialization to achieve maximum efficiency and to keep pace with the evolution of modern merchandising methods." Mr. Irwin, who joined the staff of General Motors in 1923, has held a succession of senior positions over the years in the field and at Oshawa, and prior to 1950 was Assistant Zone Manager at Montreal. He is a widely-known and respected figure in the Canadian automotive industry. Mr. Morrow joined General Motors in 1950. He served in a number of sales positions in the field, latterly as a District Sales Manager, before joining the Sales Promotion Department at Head Office in Oshawa.

Born in Vancouver in 1912, Mr. Morrow during World War II served with the Royal Navy and the RCN for five years, holding successive command of four gunboats and torpedo boats. He was wounded in 1945, and retired with the rank of Lieutenant Commander. Particularly active in community affairs in Vancouver, where his early experience centered, Mr. Morrow is a Past President of the Vancouver Junior Chamber of Commerce, Past President of the Vancouver Speakers' Club, Past President of the B.C. Debating League, Past Director of the Vancouver Theatre Under the Stars, and a Past Chairman of the Veterans' Sales Training Classes.

Markets

New York Stocks U. S. Steel Report

NEW YORK (AP)—Stocks surged ahead in a major bull market effort last week and established new high records.

On one day the market made its greatest advance for any session of the last two years. At the end of the week it was at the best levels of the last 24 years.

Monday's stock market was hesitant. Steels and aircraft displayed strong tendencies, but the entire market backed down at the close.

Tuesday's market was depressed. After the close, United States Steel reported lower first quarter profits and declared the usual dividend of 75 cents.

On Wednesday the market suffered from over what was considered insufficient dividend payments from a number of major companies. In the final hour, however, railroads came to life and the market ended higher on average.

Thursday was the big day. Bethlehem Steel and Standard Oil (NJ) raised their dividends. Republic Steel disclosed it intended to get into atomic energy to make steel, the electronic issues were strong, and a long list of miscellaneous issues forged ahead smartly. Railroads broke through to new highs.

Friday's market opened with a rush of buying orders that swamped the ticker.

In the afternoon, profit-taking appeared with enough force to cut back a considerable portion of the early gains, but the market managed to close higher on average.

Most active issue last week on the New York stock exchange was U. S. Steel up 1/4 at 46 on 238,400 shares; it was followed by Westinghouse Electric up 7/8 at 72 3/4. Canadian stocks closed the week mixed. McIntyre was up one point at 67 and Distillers Seagram added 1/2. Hiram Walker and International Nickel each slipped 1/4 and Dome Mines was off 3/4.

Royalite oil gained 1/4 on the American stock exchange and Giant Yellowknife was down 3/4.

CLEVELAND (AP)—The magazine Steel says flatly that the downward trend in steel production has ended. With the national rate holding steady at 69 per cent of production last week, Steel says: "Steel sales are no longer dropping. Steel prices, as a whole, are remaining steady. The national steel ingot production rate is holding firmly at the slightly increased rate it attained two weeks ago." The magazine in its weekly summary of the steel industry, adds: "Principally responsible for the turn-around is the completion of inventory reductions at many metal-working plants. Looming as stimulants to steel demands are the off-chance of a steelworkers strike this summer and the explosive international situation in Indo-China. Either of them could catapult a flood of buyers into the market for steel."

May holds a promise of improvement in steel output, the magazine says. A survey taken by the magazine shows consumers expect to take 3.7 per cent more steel in May than in March. Benjamin F. Fairless, chairman of United States Steel Corp., is quoted by Steel as saying he expects his company's business to improve in the next three months.
