OTTAWA (CP) — Eskimo carvings are playing a big part in helping Eskimos bridge the gap between their primitive way of life and the 20th century, the deputy minister of northern affairs said Tuesday.

Ernest Cole told a service club the financial returns of

carvings and prints have helped Eskimos increase their cash income. But more important are the psychological returns. In this time of transition when the Eskimo must plunge into the 20th century, the carvings "have brought a new awareness to the Eskimo people of their Eskimo traditions, a new sense of unity, almost of pan-Eskimotism, a new pride."

The federal government was doing all it could to guide Eskimo craft men without destroying their gifts.

U.S. Sought Through Pope To Keep Italy Out Of War

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Secret documents released by the Vatican say the United States asked Pope Pius XII to plead with Benito Mussolini to stay out of the Second World War.

The Pope is quoted as saying, when told of the Italian government's anger over one papal intervention, that he had "no fear of ending up in a concentration camp or in hostile hands."

These are among the developments described in the documents as taking place in the tense days of early 1940 when Hitler was overrunning Europe and Italy's position was yet to be decided.

The documents state that after the U.S. appeal, Pope Pius wrote Mussolini asking him to spare Europe from further sorrow.

The Fascist dictator is reported as replying he wanted to avoid war but could not guarantee Italy would be neutral.

The disclosures are made in the first volume of a series of documents from Vatican archives described as a "white paper" on the Second World War and Pope Pius' role.

The Vatican set aside a rule that its documents must be held in secret at least 50 years and began issuing the papers in an apparent answer to the controversy stirred by West German writer Rolf Hochhuth's play "The Deputy." The play questions whether Pope Pius did everything he could to stop Nazi extermination of Jews.

The Vatican has always insisted he did. The first volume does not take up the Jewish issue in detail.

That will be done in the second volume, still in preparation, covering 1940-45.

The reported Pope-Mussolini conflict took place shortly before Germany entered the war on Germany's side June 10, 1940.

MESSAGE FROM ENVOY The white paper says the message from the United States came through President Franklin D. Roosevelt's personal envoy to the Vatican, Myron Taylor, in April, 1940.

Taylor said the White House and the Vatican should act jointly in trying to dissuade Mussolini from declaring war.

The next month, three days after the Nazis invaded Belgium, Pope Pius sent messages of solidarity to the rulers of Belgium, Holland, and Luxembourg.

Giovanni Battista Montini, then an aide of Pope Pius and now Pope Paul VI, wrote a memo on what followed.

Mussolini was furious. The Vatican daily L'Osservatore Romano was informed by the Italian ambassador to the Holy See, Dino Alfieri, Mussolini considered the Pope's solidarity messages "a move against his policy."

Alfieri spoke of tension and nervousness in the Fascist camp and did "not exclude that

something grave might happen."

It was then Pope Pius said he had no fear of prison or a worse fate.

"We have not had fear of a revolver pointed against us one time and we will not have fear a second time," the Pope is quoted as saying.

The revolver reference is not clear. But it is thought it might have alluded to a reported occasion in the early years after the First World War when Pope Pius, then Archbishop Eugenio Pacelli, was serving as papal nuncio in Germany.

It has been said that he was threatened by left-wing extremists intent on gaining control of Germany.

Survivors who cherish her memory are her husband; a daughter, Mary Ellen; Mrs. Cyril J. McDonald, Hamilton, Ontario; and four sons, W.O. Joseph A., U.S. Army, now serving in Germany, who was privileged to attend the funeral; Francis, living in Souris, and Walter and Charles on the homestead. A son, Harold, predeceased her in 1943. A sister, Mary T. (Molly), Everett, Mass., also survives, and nineteen grandchildren. A sister, Bessie, Mrs. Daniel L. McDonald, and brothers, Walter, Edwin and Frank, predeceased her.

The largely attended funeral took place at St. Columba, where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by her pastor, who also conducted the services at the grave. The many friends who called, sent Mass and sympathy cards, Enrollments, flowers and telegrams were a tribute in a dear wife, mother and friend.
