CANADIAN CONTINGENT

Official List of the Officers—Equipment of Men.

OTTAWA, Oct. 23.—The official list of company officers of the contingent for South Africa was handed out to-night. It is complete with the exception of the names of the commanding officer of C Company, Toronto, but the general impression is that Colonel Sam Hughes, M.P., will be the fortunate individual.

The surgeons will, it is thought, be as already announced—Surgeon-Major Wilson and Osborne, and Surgeon-Lt Fiset.

Two chaplains, one Protestant and one Roman Catholic, have also to be appointed. In the list of officers as given above the first on the list is the captain of the company and the three following names the lieutenants.

The Canadian Transvaal contingent non-commissioned officers and men, will be furnished with the following equipment: Great coat 1, helmet (white) 1, field service cap 1, togue 1, frock (rifle serge unlined) 2, trousers (serge) 2, frock (khaki) 1 pair, leggings (leather) 1 pair, boots 2 pairs, shirts (under), 1, drawers 1 pair, abdominal bandage 1, jerseys (woolen) 1, shoes (canvas) 1 pair, brushes—cloth 1, hair 1, blacking 1, polishing 1, shaving one. Razors, spoons, knives and forks, holdalls, housewives, combs large and small clasp knives, 1 of each. Towels 2, soap (pieces) 2, socks (woolen) 4 pairs, blacking (tine) 1.

The khaki trousers are semi-knickerbockers. Between the knee and the boots "puttees" of blue serge will be wound. The "puttee" is of light texture, and is about six feet long, two and one-half inches wide, and furnishes an excellent support to the calf of the leg.

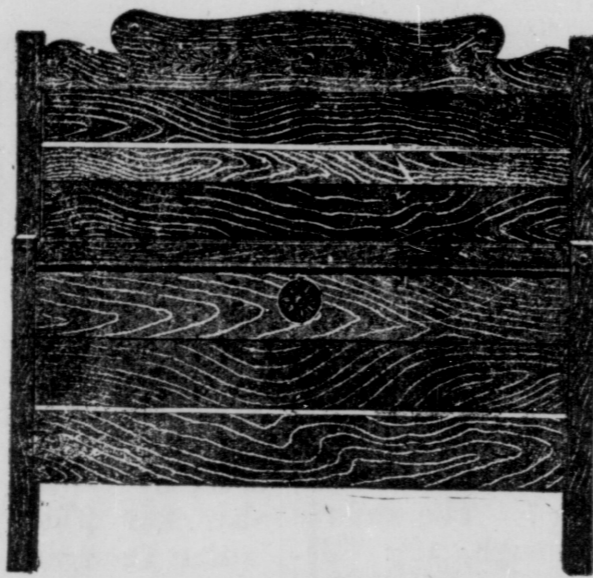
