

Cervical Dysplasia: (mentioned briefly above) is more common among women taking the pill than in women who don't take the pill.

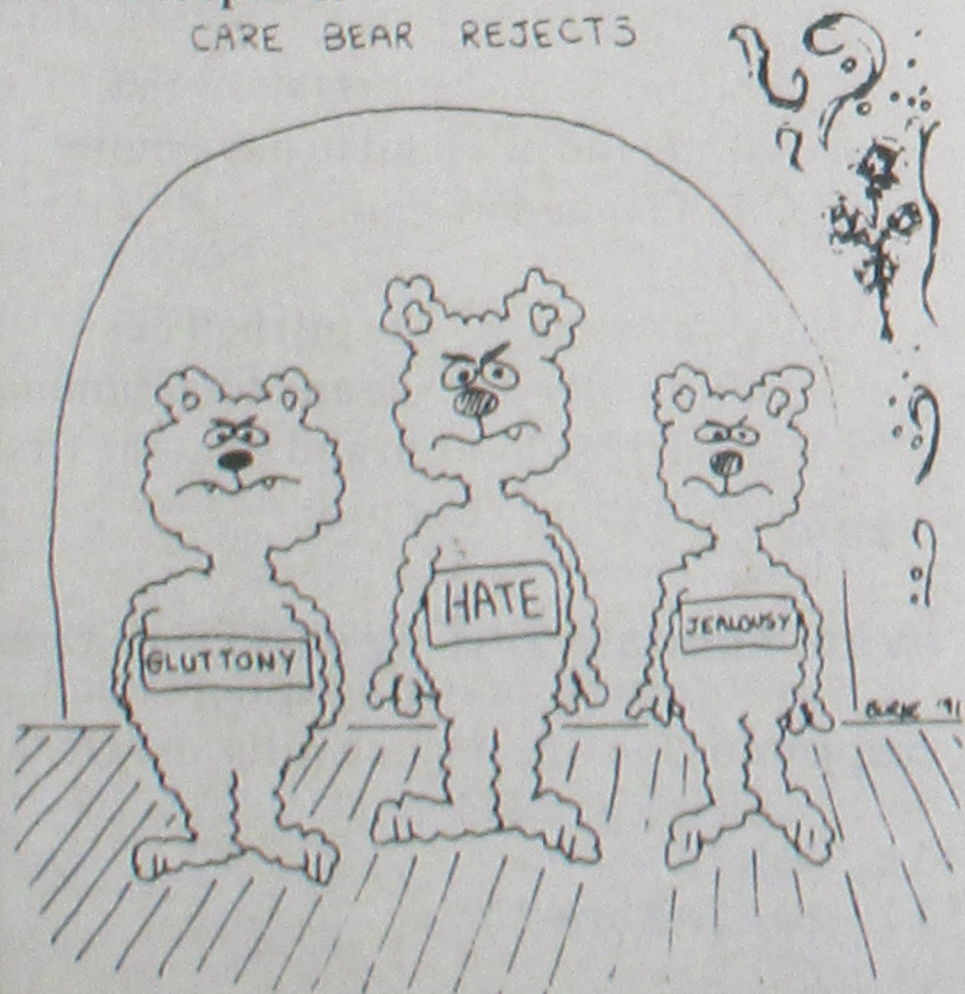
The complications of the pill include: Heart attacks, strokes, high blood pressure, cancer, headaches, diabetes, depression, vaginitis and vaginal discharge, urinary tract infection, liver and gallbladder disease, epilepsy and asthma and cervical dysplasia. And have been linked to: Pluirisy, arthritis, visual disturbances, ulcers (in the mouth), bruising antagonism with rifampin, lupus erythematosus, abdominal cramping (during first 3 months of use), changes in thyroid function, pholodermatitis (sunlight sensitivity), a form of hair loss, excessive hair growth, benign growths consisting of muscle tissue and autophonia (an ear or nasal infection). IT has not been proven that the pill causes all of the above medical problems but if they occur it could be due to the pill.

Anyone who has any of the mentions medical problems or a family history may not be a good candidate for taking the pill.

Although the pill has a few benefits, the medical problems which may occur seem to outweigh them. There are other methods of birth control which alone are not as effective as the pill but combined can protect from pregnancy and maybe save women form a lot of pain and medical expense if they should come in contact with these medical problems.

Maybe its time women took a long look at the complications incurred by the pill and start demanding more studies and hopefully a new and improved (healthier) oral contraceptive.
