Former Islander Dies In West
John C. Wisner, one of Prince Edward Island's former citizens, well known and highly respected by a large circle of friends and acquaintances here, passed to his eternal reward on April 23 last at Holy Cross Hospital, Calgary, Alberta, at the advanced age of 84 years, following a brief illness.
His sudden and unexpected death came as a great shock to the members of his family and his many friends and relatives.
Apart from the eight years spent in the Canadian West, the late Mr. Wisner had been a life-long resident of Prince Edward Island, where most of his life he successfully combined the twin occupations of farmer and operator of a flour and lumber mill at the place of his birth, Waterville, Prince Edward Island.
Eight years ago, feeling that younger minds and surer hands would best carry on the work he himself had done so well for so many years, he turned over his business to his eldest son, Emmet, and retired with his beloved wife to live with their son George, Calgary, Alberta, and to be in the company of the younger members of his family in the evening tide of his life.
Scarcely one year elapsed after his sojourn in the West, when the deceased was dealt a severe blow in death of his devoted wife, the former Margaret Bowen of Cardigan, Prince Edward Island. Deeply grieved, yet faithfully resigned to the designs of Divine Providence, the aging father of eight children bravely carried on being a source of comfort and solace to the younger members of his family bereaved of a kind and loving mother.
Though essentially a family man whose interests and concern he had always deeply at heart, the deceased was not unmindful of his duties and obligations towards other members of society and thus he lent himself unstintingly, giving of his time, talents and energy to promote the welfare of both church and State. He was a devout member of the Roman Catholic Church and an active member of the Holy Name Society and Knights of Columbus.
His quiet and unassuming nature, gentle and kind disposition, enhanced by a refined and cultured spirit, endearing qualities that won for him many friends and made him a welcome guest in any company. A wise and kind and provident Father, he will ever be held in deep and cherished memory by the bereaved members of his family who will "long for the touch of the vanished hand and the sound of the voice that is no more."
Predeceased by his wife and one son, William, he is survived by three daughters: Sister Mary of Good Counsel, C.S.M., Charlottetown Hospital, Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Mrs. Frank (Patricia) Telfer, Vernon, B. C. and Mrs. C.E. (Eileen) Kremer, Kitchener, Ont.
Also surviving are four sons: Emmet J. of Waterville, Prince Edward Island, Ira and George, Calgary, and Dennis of Strome, Alberta; Twenty grandchildren, two brothers, James, Charlottetown, and George, Winnipeg and three sisters, Margaret of Charlottetown, Josephine and Caroline of Boston, Mass.
His funeral was held from his late residence, 1712-18 Ave. N. West to St. Mary's Cathedral where Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by his Pastor, Msgr. J. Smith. Services at the grave were conducted by Rev. Father Doyle. The pallbearers were: Howard and Emmet Wright, Eric Tibble, Earle Gregory, Eddie Bowlan and Frances Curley.
Interment was in St. Mary's cemetery, Calgary, Alberta.

Spinster Pleads Guilty To Charge Of Embezzlement
NORFOLK, Va. (AP) — Minnie Mangum pleaded guilty Monday to embezzling \$1,082,968.25 from her employer, the now-defunct Commonwealth Building and Loan Association.
The 52-year-old spinster stood up in a crowded courtroom and made her plea in a low voice.
Her plea came after Ira White, deputy clerk of corporation court, had read 22 counts in an indictment. She pleaded guilty to the 22nd and final count which represented the aggregate of the other counts.
These smaller thefts were alleged to have occurred between December, 1933, and December, 1935.
Miss Mangum was found guilty by a jury last Thursday of making false statements to the state corporation commission in 1946 concerning the condition of the association and sentenced to 10 years in prison. She was charged with understating liabilities by \$248,400.08.

Fire Razes Paris Fair Buildings
PARIS (Reuters) — Seventy-six exhibitors lost their stands at the Paris international fair Monday when fire razed buildings over an area of 3,600 square yards.
Damage is estimated at about 50,000,000 francs (\$140,000). The stands were in the fair's French section, where regional products were on display. Police believe a cigarette butt started the blaze.
The fire was discovered by watchmen shortly after midnight. Refreshment stands were ablaze and soon flames leaped more than 100 feet into the air. A dozen fire engines had the fire under control within an hour.
Of the 15,500 exhibitors, 2,800 are from foreign countries. The fair opened on May 5 and closed Monday.
