Five-Month Textile Strike
Settled In Quebec Province

MONTREAL (CP) - Con-
tracts governing 5,000 workers
at five Quebec textile mills
were signed Tuesday by com-
pany and union representatives,
officially ending a five-month
strike by Dominion Textile em-
ployees, described as the most
costly in the history of the in-
dustry in Quebec.

The contract, negotiated
by representatives of Dominion
Textile and the National Fed-
eration of Textile Workers
(CNTU), was approved during
the past week by workers at
the Sherbrooke, Drummond-
ville, Magog and Montmorency
mills and at Domil, the com-
pany's subsidiary plant in Sher-
brooke.

But pickets remained at the
mills Tuesday prior to the con-
tract signing, as the union de-
manded the company withdraw
legal charges made against
some of its members as a result
of strike incidents. Later the
picket lines were lifted.

A company spokesman Tues-
day said the company had with-
drawn charges 10 days ago.

Union officials could not be
reached immediately for com-
ment after the signing.

GET 33-CENT INCREASE
The contract provides for an
increase of 33 cents an hour
over a three-year period. The
strikers had asked for a 42-cent
increase on the present \$1.79
average hourly rate.

At the company's annual
meeting July 29, president E. F.
King said the strike had cost

around \$6,000,000. It began in
March. The union's contract ex-
pired Feb. 15.

The dispute was marked by
incidents, including bombings,
which occurred at the com-
pany's Montreal plant and at
the homes of two Dominion Textile
officials in Magog.

The Montreal plant was not
affected by the strike because
its employees belong to a dif-
ferent union.

Mr. Gregoire was elected

to stop letting themselves be
used by some newspapers to
fight a political party.

Mr. Gregoire said in a written
statement here that La Nation
had published two articles of an
anti-semitic nature.

But he said the first, entitled
International Jewry Supports
Lesage, merely repeated re-
marks by Premier Daniel John-
son of Quebec. The second, en-
titled Jews Seiff at Quebec, was
a reader's letter which slipped
into the editorial columns by
mistake.
