Grain

WINNIPEG, Oct. 17 — (CP) — Early advances in coarse grain futures prices on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange were reduced or erased in the last half of today's session.

Selling and hedging sales increased in the last half hour. Some appeared prompted by an easier tone at Chicago.

Earlier in the session, there was fair buying in oats and barley with offerings light in the October contract.

Processing interests took flax and U.S. demand for rye was indicated. Offerings were light.

There were indications of overseas export business in barley. Export loadings of wheat in recent days totalling 2,700,000 bushels were reported. Belgium took 150,000 bushels, Norway 360,000; Switzerland 345,000, the United Kingdom 500,000, Bolivia 50,000 and the Netherlands 300,000.

Prices for class two and I.W.A. wheat were unchanged.
