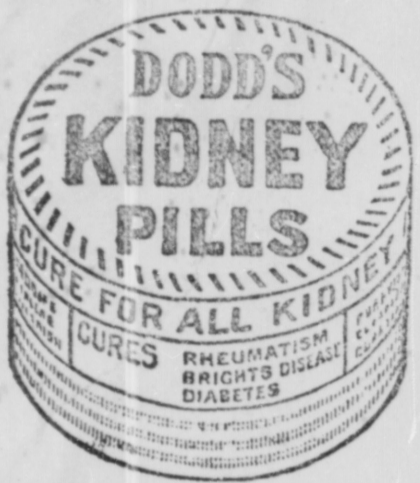

**BAD ROADS.**

**A Complaint From Kensington.**

Sir,—I wish to say a word about the condition of the roads and bridges in the vicinity of Kensington; and I must say that never in the history of the surrounding country have the roads and bridges in this section been in such a bad state. A few Sundays ago, on the 11th inst, the writer saw a gentleman temporarily repairing a bridge in close proximity to this village in order to make it passable for conveyances going to and from church. This morning a team of horses with a truck-wagon load of canned lobsters from the factory of Peter McNutt, Esq., M P P,—the representative for the riding,—broke through Tuplin's Bridge, Indian River. The load was precipitated into the stream and the wagon smashed, and the horse had a narrow escape from receiving injury. Besides this there are minor accidents of daily occurrence. The general cry from all shades of politicians is that we never had such bad roads under any government.

The superintendent general of the various departments of the government service who has arrogated to himself the doubtful right of looking after those various departments, should take a trip down this way; and it would be a good way for him and the representatives from Malpeque to spend Dominion Day in driving over these roads and making a note of their condition: consequent on their mal administration.

During the reign of the Sullivan government, there were twelve new bridges built in this district, and only one under the present government,—and even that one is already showing the partisan jobbery.

I may say in conclusion, that with heavy load of milk coming to the Kensington cheese factory every morning, besides the other traffic inseparable from a thriving village, the supporters at least of the present impotent Government deserve better treatment.
