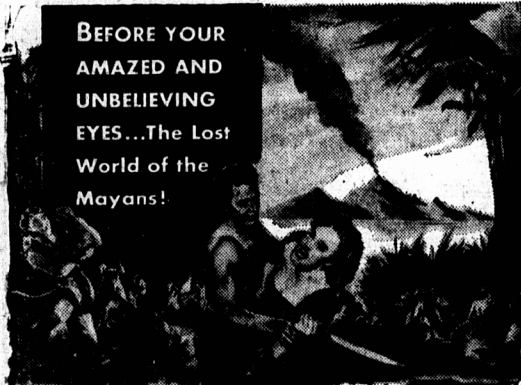

Anniversary Service At St. David's Ch., Geo'town

The anniversary preacher at St. David's United Church, Georgetown, on July the 26th will be the Rev. Dr. B. Hardie, professor of Hebrew and Old Testament at Pine Hill Divinity College, who will preach both morning and evening.

In 1837, the year Queen Victoria began her reign, there was prepared in Charlottetown a document which reads in part as follows: "Know ye that I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitzroy, Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Her Majesty's Island Prince Edward and its Dependencies, do give grant, and confirm unto the Reverend Roderick MacAulay, Minister of the Presbyterian Church in Georgetown, William MacKay of Georgetown, Elder of said Church, George Aitken Senior of the same place, Elder of same Church, and James MacPherson of Montague River, Elder of same church, and to their successors in office forever these pieces or parcels of land in Georgetown known as town lots number eleven and twelve, as a site for a Church, in connection with, and governed by and according to the rules, regulations and disciplines of The Kirk of Scotland, as established by law.

Subsequent Ministers In 1861 came to his first parish a young man who had just been ordained, George Munroe Grant, afterwards Dr. Grant, Principal of Queens University. He was followed by Alexander MacWilliams, and Mr. MacWilliams by Peter Melville, who is remembered by several of our present congregation. Mr. Melville preached in Montague, where a new church had been erected. In 1877 came John MacKinnon with his wife and three small sons, one of whom became evening with songs.

Fine Library Building Opened At Murray River

A new library building for Murray River and surrounding communities was officially opened Thursday evening July 23, by Dr. L. W. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Education, at a well attended public meeting. Dr. M. L. Bonnell, M.L.A., acted as chairman. In his opening remarks Dr. Bonnell stated the new library was an institution in which the whole community could take pride, and praised the work of the library committee and its chairman Mr. George O. Whiteway in their untiring efforts to bring the project to a successful completion. Dr. L. W. Shaw felt that the community had taken a step forward in providing a fine well equipped building to house its public library. He referred to the library as the heart of the educational life providing fresh ideas and experiences to enrich the whole body of the community. Books and reading are essentials for the modern world, he said. Mr. H. B. Chandler, Director of Libraries outlined the work of the committee in planning the new library and emphasized that it was a co-operative effort of the whole area which includes not only Murray River, but the communities of Little Sands, Dover, Hopfield, Point Pleasant, Alliston, Cambridge, Gladstone, Glen William, and Murray Harbor North. Materials, labor and money had been contributed so that the building was debt free at the time of opening. The librarian, Mrs. Oliver Gilchrist, would be in charge of a fine collection of books, and the library would be open three afternoons weekly, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from three to five, and Saturday evenings from seven to nine. Compliments Community Rev. Wallace MacPherson complimented the community on its new building and praised the work of the Prince Edward Island Libraries staff and of the local committee. Mr. John Martin presented a most interesting program of films, congratulated the community on its library and spoke briefly on available film services. Mr. Blair White entertained during the

Principal of Pine Hill. Mr. MacKinnon returned to Scotland in 1883 and H. Spencer became Minister to both St. Andrews in Montague and St. David's in Georgetown. In 1888 Montague was made a separate charge and Mr. Spencer was moved there. When he left Georgetown A. W. Mason became Pastor here, then A. W. Herdeman, who was followed by Frank S. Coffin. Owing to ill health Mr. Coffin remained only two months, and George Robinson was sent to finish the year. He remained until 1909 when Rev. Herbert Toombs was inducted as Minister. He was followed by Rev. A. J. W. Beck, and Mr. Beck by Rev. J. A. Greenlees, from 1915 to 1922, when he left to take up his duties as Librarian in the Presbyterian College at Montreal. The next minister was Rev. David MacDonan, under whom the tenure Church Union took place. Rev. Henry Pierce, Rev. Colin MacNeil and the Rev. John Stirling held pastorates in that succession until 1941 when Rev. Sydney Boyce was inducted and remained for the next ten years. Rev. Mr. Boyce was succeeded by the present pastor, Rev. W. A. Paterson whose interest and zeal have inspired this anniversary service and under whose ministry the commodious church hall was built.
