

Requests For Dietitians Services Exceed Supply

OTTAWA (CP)—Jean Macdonald has two big jobs—she looks after both diet and status. Elected president of the Canadian Dietetic Association this summer, she heads a 1,300-member organization which promotes the profession and campaigns for better nutrition habits for all Canadians.

Miss Macdonald is also director of dietetic services for the Department of Veterans Affairs here. She makes annual rounds of 16 veterans' hospitals across Canada, happily noting the beneficial results of dietetic treatment.

She told a reporter she likes travelling and finds the results of treatment by diet in hospitals a rewarding part of her regular work.

The fact that dietitians are gradually gaining legal recognition and professional status is a reward in its own way, too.

Miss Macdonald is an original member of the association, formed on a national level 21 years ago. It now is in the process of forming provincial groups across

Canada. Manitoba and Quebec have already incorporated provincial associations, and Quebec has passed the first legislation to grant legal recognition and professional status to dietitians, she said.

Today, business and industry are increasing the demands for dietitians. "Requests for services far exceed the number trained," she said.

A Montrealee and a graduate of McGill University with a household science degree, Miss Macdonald was awarded the lieutenant-governor's medal for general proficiency and a special certificate from Quebec's Department of Education.

Her internship at the Royal Victoria Hospital in Montreal started her in a career as a hospital dietitian. She has worked at her present post since 1949.

Miss Macdonald has also been a booster of the association from its inception, and held numerous executive posts before her election as president at the last national convention in Edmonton.

Princess Invited To Attend B. C. Centennial

Canadian Press Staff Writer OTTAWA (CP)—Princess Margaret is almost certain to make her first official trip to Canada in 1958, a highly-placed federal informant disclosed today.

However, it is not likely to be a cross-country tour.

The vivacious 26-year-old sister of the Queen has been invited to participate in British Columbia's 1958 centennial and her tour may be limited to that province.

The informant said it is not official yet but the princess has indicated quite clearly that she wants to come.

Regional, rather than national tours, may be the pattern of fu-

ture royal visits to Canada.

MORE FREQUENT TRIPS

Members of the Royal Family have expressed a desire to make more frequent trips to this country but are concerned over the time involved in a cross-country tour.

This likely will not be the case when Queen Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh cross the Atlantic to officiate at the opening of the St. Lawrence seaway in 1959.

That will be the Queen's first visit to Canada since her ascendency to the throne and it probably will be the occasion of a cross-country trip.

But later visits by the Queen may be patterned along that planned for Princess Margaret—a regional trip to some specific Canadian area for some specific purpose.

At present Princess Margaret is planning a tour of East Africa to start Sept. 21. The only time she was on Canadian territory was early last year when a plane carrying her to the West Indies stopped at Montreal for fuel.
