German Question In Issue

Soviet Premier Alexei Kosygin has wasted no time stressing to the French a topic that will get priority in his talks with President de Gaulle—the future of Germany.

Kosygin attacked the "forces of fascism and war," which he said rose again "even more overbearing and arrogant" in recent state elections in West Germany.

The French president has been determinedly carrying out an independent foreign policy which differs in many respects from that of his Western allies.

But any concessions to Russia on Germany—such as recognition in any form of the East German regime—could cause a sharply hostile reaction in Bonn at a time when there are chances of warmer French relations.
