Stock Prices At New York

Moved Higher During Week NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market made its third best advance of the year last week as talk about the recession and how to beat it reached a crescendo.

An estimated 4,250,000,000 was added to the quoted value of stocks listed on the New York Stock Exchange, based on the rise in the Associated Press average.

The AP 60 - stock average jumped 3.40 to 162.60. The market's rise broke a string of three straight weekly declines.

For the first three days this week the market plugged ahead moderately. Thursday it surged upward for its best daily rise in two months. Friday's mixed market held the gains.

The outstanding piece of financial news during the week was another cut Thursday in the discount rate by the federal reserve board—the third since November.

Oils were helped by improved sentiment toward their industry situation and were market leaders. Steels came to the fore in mid-week on reports consumer inventories were reaching bottom.

and last week Wheeling Steel brought three blast furnaces and its Bessemer department back into production.

U. S. Steel Production Down Again

CLEVELAND (AP)—Steel production last week fell off a point to return to the low mark of the current recession at 52.5 per cent of capacity, and steelmakers still are looking for their first clear indication of an upturn, Steel magazine says.

"So far as March is concerned, improvement doesn't seem to be in the cards," the weekly journal of metalworking reports. "Steel men believe April will see the start of the upturn."

Chevrolet, one of the strongest producers until now, already had cancelled about half of its April steel orders, and other car makers were pushing March orders into April.

Cold weather had hindered an early start of spring construction, but there was demand for large quantities of galvanized sheets for ductwork in air conditioning of office buildings. Production of tin plate continues at near-capacity level.

Jones and Laughlin Steel Corp. suspended operations in Detroit, but Youngstown reactivated two open hearth furnaces March 1. This week Wheeling Steel Corp. will reactivate two open hearths.

TORONTO (CP)—Acme Paper Co., vice president of Acme Paper Products Company Inc., Thursday announced his company will award a yearly scholarship to a university student in physics, mathematics or allied field.

Mr. Oelbaum said "we have some larger measure of acknowledgment from a general public which reveres film and TV and idolizes sports heroes."

Dr. W. A. Murray, Alumni representative at the meeting, stated that even if the University gave the present old Mens' Residence for a Student Union Building that it might only be temporary as expansion plans of the University in other matters might call for its removal at any time.

Most Council members felt that renovating the Mens' Residence would be a little better than present facilities and that a new building was desirable.

LOCATION The Council then adopted a motion that a Students' Union Building if and when built be situated between Forrest and Studley camps. The reason for the site selection was that there is very little space on Studley campus for additional buildings and it was also felt that more professional students particularly Med and Dent would use the facilities if they were closer to the Forrest campus.

A survey is to be made throughout the campus on the desires of the student body with regard to the S.U.B., and the method of financing the problem also came in for considerable debate. Along with voting thanks to the Students' Union Building Report Committee the Council also moved that the following items would be essential features of any new student building and would receive priority during the first stage of construction: book store, lounges for men and women, cafeteria and snack bar, auditorium (convertible to a dance floor), game rooms, meeting rooms, and various administrative offices.

In as much as matters of this type must be approved by the University, the executive of the Dalhousie Students' Council was advised to meet with the University officials and inform them of the action taken to date by the student government.

BERLIN (AP)—William J. Berling, once a powerful police boss in East Germany, died in obscurity. He lost his position of state secretary in 1953 and Communist Party membership.

A brief notice in the Communist newspaper Berliner Arbeiter Zeitung said Berling died Monday at 63 after a long illness.

Zaissner was a veteran Communist organizer who gained international fame as "General War" during the Spanish Civil War. He commanded international brigades of volunteers fought against the Franco forces.
