

Shipyard Strike In U. K. May End But Others Loom

LONDON (AP) — Negotiators seeking to head off what could be Britain's worst labor walkout in 31 years Friday reported finding a basis for settling a shipyard strike and averting one on the railways.

But still hanging over the troubled nation was a series of strikes scheduled to begin snowballing today in key heavy industries.

This was the situation on the three labor fronts:
Shipyard — Union ad shipbuilders reached a basis for negotiating an end to the six-day strike of 200,000 workers. Details were not reported. The workers average \$36.24 a week and have demanded a 10-per-cent increase. Talks resume Monday but, meantime, the strike still shuts down 70 shipyards.

Announce Dates For Two Major P. E. I. Summer Events

CHARLOTTETOWN

Dates have been announced for two of the biggest annual summer events in Prince Edward Island.

The largest event, the Island's 69 year old harness racing classic, will be held from August 12th to 17th in Charlottetown. Featuring five days and five nights of sulky racing, the 1957 edition of Old Home Week and Provincial Exhibition will bring together, once again, the best race horses in Eastern Canada. Besides the racing, which is run off on one of the finest tracks east of Montreal, the big show features a large livestock exhibition, vaudeville, and a midway attraction.

The other big attraction is the Summerside Lobster Carnival to be held in Summerside from July 15th to 20th. This will be the second annual give monetary assistance to the rural schools both for music instruction and for transportation to the festival. Later when Choral Reading and Dancing had been added to the syllabus assistance for transportation was also given to these classes if extra trips were necessary. The money was allotted according to the number of pupils participating and the distance from the festival.

Unfortunately the finances of the Festival Association have not kept pace with its growth. The grant from the government has not been increased but the expenses, especially those for the several adjudicators now needed, have multiplied. The proceeds from entry fees and donations are inadequate. In 1956 the executive found it necessary to cut the Percentage Allowment Amount. However the Festival Days now held in Prince and Kings Counties cut the distances travelled. The executive hope that more children will be able to participate and many more parents hear their perform. Applications for assistance for schools more than fourteen miles from the festival are now received by the Secretaries, Mrs. Wendell Wood, Central Royalty and Miss Mary Donahoe, Prince of Wales College. Though the amount of the remuneration is less it is still a definite help to those schools needing assistance. Applications should be made as soon as the entries for the classes have been mailed.

MUSIC FESTIVAL AND MUSICIANS

PERCENTAGE ALLOTMENT

In 1947 the president of the Prince Edward Island Music Festival Association recommended in his report that a Percentage Allowment Committee be formed. She was looking forward to the time when music appreciation and participation would become part of the life of every child in rural communities.
