

# Island Proposes ARDA Projects

Industry and Fisheries Minister Roy Foster and Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae met in Ottawa over the weekend to prepare the province's submission to Ottawa under the Agricultural Rehabilitation and Development Act for the approval of 28 projects for the Island costing in the vicinity of \$20,000.

Mr. Foster flew to the federal capital on Sunday. The agriculture minister joined him from Toronto where he was attending the Royal Water Fair.

The type of project promoted by the province ranges from development of the fishermen's co-op at Rustico to the construction of dams and ponds.

The plan is also reported to include such items as a substantial development of Cedar Dunes Park at West Point, a large scale handicraft program, the development of more adequate facilities at Brudenell Park, a recreational complex for 16 e Athletes Regional High School near Summerside and an industrial park complex for the Montserrat area. In addition there are research projects and provisions for the strengthening of the division of research.

## CTF Brief Presented To Gov't.

A copy of the brief presented to the federal government last week by the Canadian Teachers Federation was presented to Premier Walter H. Shaw yesterday by a delegation from the P.E.I. Teachers Federation.

# Alternate Route To Ferry Assured

Provincial Secretary J. David Stewart has been given assurance by officials of the New Brunswick government that while construction of the Trans-Canada Highway between Aulic and Cape Tormentine is in progress, an alternate route to the N.B.-P.E.I. ferry terminal will be provided next year.

Concern has been expressed over the conditions of the Cape Tormentine highway, particularly in view of the fact that a great number of visitors are expected to come to the province by way of Cape Tormentine.

**GOOD CONDITION**  
Mr. Stewart said that New Brunswick's Premier Robichaud and Finance Minister I.G. DeBrissy have assured him that the alternate route, from Shediac through Murray's Corner and Bayfield to a point near Tormentine, will be in good condition next year. There are a few miles near Murray's Corner that need to be paved, and this will be done this fall or next spring, Mr. Stewart said.

"The alternate route," Mr. Stewart said, "will handle traffic from the west, and tourists and visitors coming from the direction of Amherst, N.S., can travel to Ydish and approach the Trans-Canada Highway at Port Egin. In addition, we will advise that persons travelling to this province from Nova Scotia use the Wood Islands ferry route."

Mr. Stewart said the work on the Aulic-Cape Tormentine portion of the highway will be completed as quickly as possible. "In the meantime," he said, "the alternate route from Shediac will be well marked with signs, pointing the direction to Prince Edward Island."

### Baghdad Has Sporadic Firing

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP)—Sporadic firing continued in Baghdad Tuesday but President Abdel Salam Aref's new military regime appeared firmly in control after taking power in a tank-led coup.

# Harpichord Is Pride Of School Music Dept.

As you walk through the corridors of the "annex" section of "old West Kent" you may suddenly become aware of a faint noise, somewhat foreign among the usual typewriter noises of offices are known to make.

"It says, it's a beastly bit of Bach," you muse.

But what's the source? Obviously not a radio; no commercials.

You track down the melody to a closed door, on which there is a small, neatly printed sign informing you that this is the office of Christopher Gledhill, provincial director of music for schools.

You knock, you enter. There is Mr. Gledhill, cigarette clamped, playing intricate melodies on a harpichord.

Not just any harpichord. This harpichord, he tells you with obvious pride, was built by the department of education from a kit purchased in England. Most of the work was done by Charles Hamm, Victory Avenue, and technical assistance on the project was given by the music director, himself.

It is a beautiful instrument, finished in mahogany veneer. Standing about three feet high, it resembles a miniature grand piano.

As you glance at the keyboard you think "hey, the 'black keys' are white", they are. And the 'white keys' are a deep chestnut.

The three legs can be removed, and the instrument will then fit into a station wagon with ease.

Mr. Gledhill says it is proposed to take the harpichord around to various Island schools for lecture-recitals. These will be arranged on a first-come, first-served basis.

strings. Each of these had to be fitted with pivot, tongue, felts, springs, grub screws, capstan screw and leather, and the delicate job of regulating had to be done to each jack.

The result is an instrument with two registers, one sounding an octave higher than the other. There is a 'lute' effect on the lower register.

According to Mr. Gledhill, this is the first harpichord ever built in the Maritimes. Indeed, few have been constructed in Canada.

Mr. Hamm, a modest man described by the music director as "a genius," says this was the first time he had ever built a musical instrument.

He can not recall the number of pieces the harpichord had come in, but he notes rather wryly that there had been about 1,500 holes to bore."
