Says Stamp Is Like a Still
OTTAWA (CP)—The design on Canada's 2-cent stamp was described in the Commons Friday as depicting something "like a still used in the manufacture of moonshine."

The description, which brought a roar of laughter, came from F. D. Shaw (S.C.—Red Deer) who asked Postmaster General William Hamilton whether he could explain the design.

Mr. Hamilton said the stamp was approved by the previous Liberal postmaster general, Hon. Hugges Lapointe, in the June 10 election. He suggested Mr. Shaw's "best course" was to ask Mr. Lapointe what the design signifies.

Later, a post office official said the red-colored stamp, issued in June, 1956, was dedicated to Canada's chemical industry. It depicts a large flask, half-filled with liquid in the centre of the flask is a design of a chemical plant.

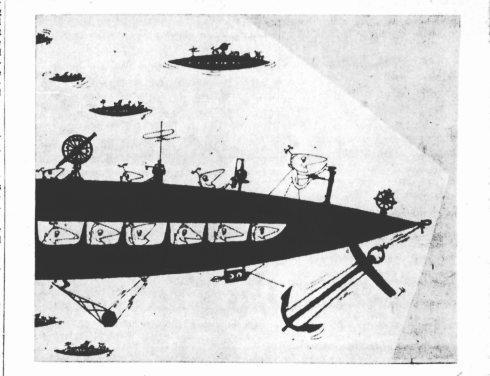

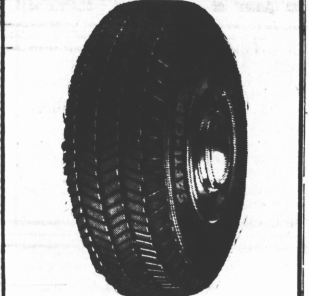
