

Wheat Pool Agents Join Metal Project

REGINA (CP) — Interprovincial Steel and Pipe Corporation of Regina has set up with the agents of the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool, a novel system for collecting scrap steel from the province's farms, which abound in discarded machinery.

About 1,100 designated wheat pool agents operating near rail lines purchase scrap steel from farmers for \$10 a ton.

IPSCO, which has its blast furnaces north of here, sends 12 crews to cut up the scrap and load it aboard rail cars for shipment to the plant.

The wheat pool bills IPSCO for a \$15 a ton of steel collected plus a 15-cent commission for each of its agents.

The pool itself makes no money from the transactions.

"We do it as a service to the farmers of the province," says W. J. Bull, manager of the wheat pool country and terminal elevator division.

The collection method, similar to one used in Second World War salvage drives, went into operation four years ago when IPSCO asked if the pool could help out.

IPSCO gets the majority of the scrap from junk dealers and the railways. Between them the railways and the wheat pool provide up to 25,000 tons a year.

The wheat pool is one of the most efficient means of collecting "live steel," says Gordon King, manager of the steel plant.

BEST AGENTS

Some farmers fill rubber tires with concrete to increase the weight but the agents usually notice it and make allowances.

"We put complete trust in the pool agents and losses are negligible. They are reliable men and all are bonded."

IPSCO says higher prices for scrap from railways and dealers than it does for scrap collected by pool agents because the railways and junk dealers deliver right to the plant.

The pool system requires a large amount of administrative work and IPSCO has to send out crews to collect the scrap, Mr. Bull says. He adds the price paid for scrap in western Canada is lower now than three years ago because Canada has dropped out of the scrap market.

A big advantage of the pool collection system is that it eliminates three handling processes in all other scrap must go through.

The scrap collected by pool agents is loaded into open gondola rail cars at the shipping plants. The gondola cars roll to the IPSCO plant on a spur line where an electro-magnet picks out the scrap.

About 200 elevator agents in the province collect large quantities of steel each year. The highest tonnage last year was 60 tons from the elevator at Colfax.

Pay Increase Scheduled for U.S. Forces

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted unanimously Tuesday to fatten the pay cheques of nearly all men and women in the military, reserve, national guard and retired—in the U.S. armed forces beginning Oct. 1.

Passage by a vote of 84 to 0 of the measure to the House of Representatives, which in 1958 passed a somewhat stimulative but less generous bill.

This first general military pay increase since 1958 would give more money to everyone in military uniform except recruits and privates and apprentice sergeants with less than two years' service.

President Kennedy urged passage of such an increase in pay because inadequate income and housing are hurting military morale.

Associated Press survey showed that thousands of army, air force and marine men say had to turn to charity because they are unable to make ends meet on their government income.

Church Problems Seen Different

MONTREAL (CP) — Very Rev. Maurice Harland, Anglican Bishop of Durham, England, said Tuesday that the problems of Anglican and Roman Catholic churches are so different that the Roman Catholic ecclesiastical council could not be discussed at the conference of Anglican churches in Toronto.

Bishop Harland was one of seven Anglican bishops who arrived here on their way to the conference, which is to study the "unions" of churches to their bishops.

ASKS BAN A-ARMS

OTTAWA (CP) — Mr. Justice Thomsen, president of the Supreme Court and president of the Canadian Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament, said Tuesday Canada should renounce nuclear weapons. "Canada can make her best contribution towards disarmament and peace by renouncing the acquisition, use or control of nuclear weapons for her forces both at sea and abroad," he said in a statement tied to the 10th anniversary of the atom-bombing of Hiroshima.

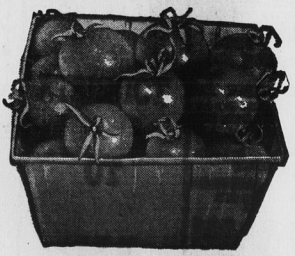
