**Jail Term Given On Two Charges**

ALBERTON — James Everett Powers, Alberton South, was sentenced by Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald at Alberton yesterday to three months each on charges of failing to stop at the scene of an accident and driving while impaired. The sentences are to run concurrently.

A charge against Gerald Benedict McKenna, Bloomfield, of possession of 467 undressed lobsters and with using a half-ton truck in committing the offense, was dismissed by the magistrate who stated that the evidence taken the previous week from four fishery officers failed to prove ownership of the truck seized in connection with the case.

Neither had it been proven, the magistrate continued, that a number of lobsters left unattended for a time on the side of the road was the property of the accused.

Previous to the dismissal an attempt by prosecutor, William W. Reddin to re-open the case for the Crown, was disallowed.

Similar charges against Nelder William Costain, Elmsdale, RR, and Calvin Costain, St. Lawrence, were adjourned for a week.

For failing to transfer registration of a motor vehicle, Melvin Charles Ramsay, Campbellton, was fined \$10 and costs.

Clifford Biggar, Alberton, was fined \$25 and costs or 30 days for possession of liquor not purchased from a vendor.

Claud David Barnett, Alberton, received a fine of \$75 and costs or 15 days for having care and control of a motor vehicle while impaired.

Valmore Richard, Tignish, was fined \$10 and costs for driving without due care and attention and Nelson DesRoches, Tignish, given a similar fine for operating an improperly equipped vehicle. Margaret Adams, Elmsdale, was fined \$10 and costs for improperly parking a motor vehicle.

One man was fined \$20 and costs for being intoxicated in a public place.

**Rich Eilerslie R. Oyster Bed To Be Open For Fall Fishing**

SUMMERSIDE — Public oyster fishing in an area of the Eilerslie River reportedly one of the world's richest beds, will be permitted to October 1 to Nov. 30.

The announcement was made yesterday by Dr. Orville H. Phillips, member of parliament for Summerside, who received a telegram from Hon. Angus MacLean, minister of fisheries, confirming the opening of this federally controlled oyster bed for public fishing for the period stated above.

Located near the federal marine biological station at Eilerslie who have used the area for growing and oyster research projects, the area that will be open to the public was opened publicly for the first time last year for a similar period.

During the season last year as many as 144 boats were counted in the area, and fishermen made as much as \$89 a day, with the total catch taken from the beds valued at more than \$33,000.00.
