

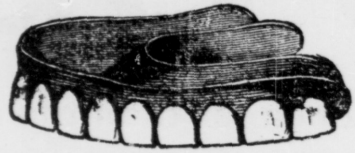

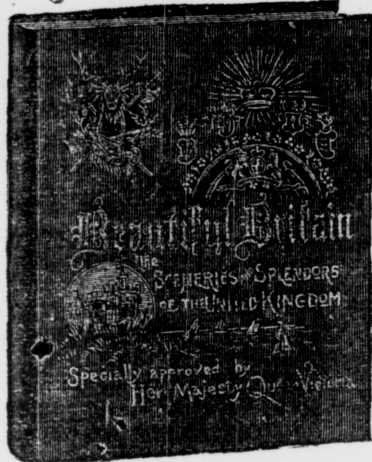

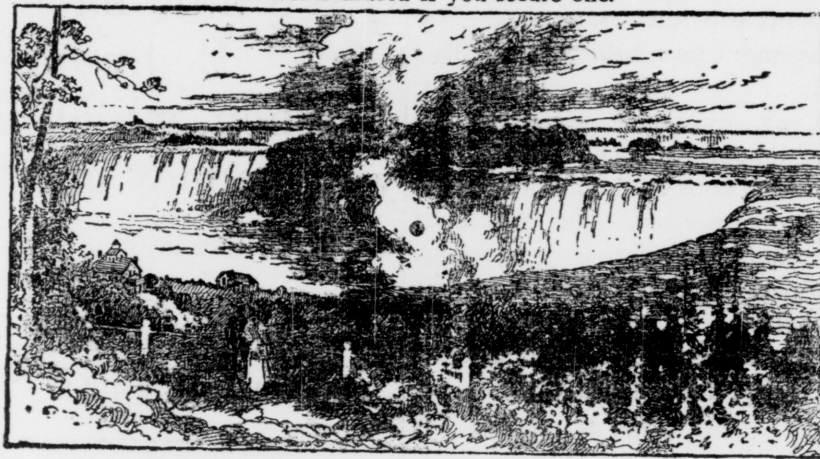

And for the old, the storied, the historic, we go to him. What he has in a sense our own. It is a hand-made and a time-mellowed beauty: for us the beauty of history and association, ours as well as his. We give him stupendous nature dotted with new cities that seem old enough to us. He gives us the story of our common race written in piled stones and clustering ivy, representing the toil and hope of centuries; a toil and hope which we inherited, and whose memorials are also ours.

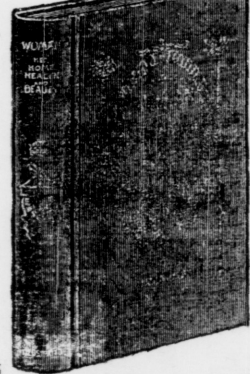
