The 1987 Terry Fox Run was the most successful ever for the UPEI residences of Marian and Bernardine Halls. A combined total of seventy students from the two buildings took part in the September 13th fund-raiser for cancer research.

Marian Hall, which has become known for its inventive approaches to the annual event, surprised everyone by towing a bathtub over the six km. course. Dressed in bathrobes and waving a banner which

read, "Help Us Clean Up Cancer," the men had no trouble attracting attention and collecting over \$200 from generous motorists. Gary Fraser piloted the tub for Marian, despite having completed the gruelling Island Marathon only hours earlier.

Bernardine Hall completed the run dressed in everything from devil costumes to frog suits and colourful Hawaii outfits. The women pushed each other in shopping carts, attempting on several occa-

sions to pass Marian's racing tub.

The two residences have donated \$650 to the Canadian Cancer Society in memory of Scott Holt, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Holt of Summerside. Scott was a 1986 freshman resident of Marian Hall who succumbed to leukemia in August, less than one year after learning he had the disease. A talented athlete, Scott was a likeable young man who is sincerely missed by his friends at UPEI. ■

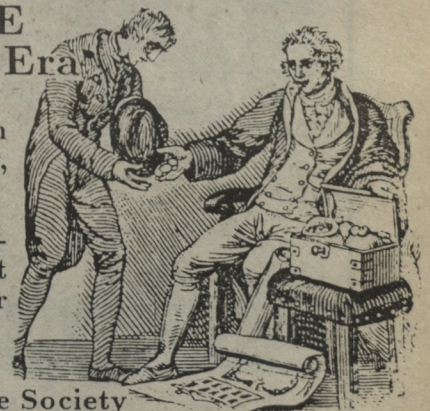
