

Sugar in the Byre.

The Lancet suggests that the British agriculturists might make more use of sugar for feeding and fattening cattle. Owing to the glut in the market, the coarser sorts can be obtained to an exceptional cheap rate, refuse molasses being quoted at one cent per pound, and jaggery at very little more. At these rates, therefore, the farmer could well afford to treat his beasts more liberally with saccharine additions to the usual food. It has been ascertained that sugar exercises a beneficial effect upon cows in regard to both the flavor and the quantity of their milk. It also improves pigs, and sheep, thrive upon it when it is mixed with the ordinary provender. All animals are partial to it, and in the case of horses, sleekness of skin is thought to be produced by a saccharine dietary.

Softening Leather.

Kerosene will soften leather belts or boots that have become hard from exposure or use around the wash room. Good for the harness when hard from rain or dampness. Wash with warm water, then grease with good animal oil or dressing like the following: One gallon of neatfoot oil, two pounds of bayberry tallow, two pounds of beeswax, two pounds of beef tallow. Put the above in a pan over a moderate fire. When thoroughly dissolved add two quarts of castor oil, then while on the fire stir in one ounce of lampblack. Mix well and strain through a fine cloth to remove sediment, let cool, and you have as fine a dressing for harness or leather of any kind as can be used.

Horseradish.

The botanical name of this well known garden plant and popular condiment is "Armoracia radia," a native of western Europe. It is remarkable tenacious of life, and spreads itself without artificial aid, coming up sometimes at long distances from the parent plants in soils adapted to its growth. The root contains an acrid oil similar to, if not identical with, that of mustard, and and to the pungent flavor of this oil is due the desire for grated horseradish as a condiment. It is considered medicinally as a harmless stimulant, of use in dyspepsia, and a syrup prepared from the root is used in colds and rheumatism.

Shadow Talking.

Her teacher stood between the gas light and the wall, thus outlining his profile distinctly. His pupil stood behind him read from the shadow on the wall the words that he uttered.

Every Time.

Good baking soda gives instant relief to a burn or scald. Applied either dry or wet to the burned part immediately the sense of relief is magical. It seems to withdraw the heat and with it the pain. The moisture from a burn is an acid which the soda attacks and neutralizes.

Cream Spots.

Common wheat flour made into paste with cold water, applied dry, will take out grease spots without injuring the most delicate fabric.

Removing Mildew.

Mildew may be removed by dipping the stained parts into buttermilk and putting them in the sun.

Wide Apart Science.

Fruit stains may be removed by freezing. True, there's no freezing in fruit time.

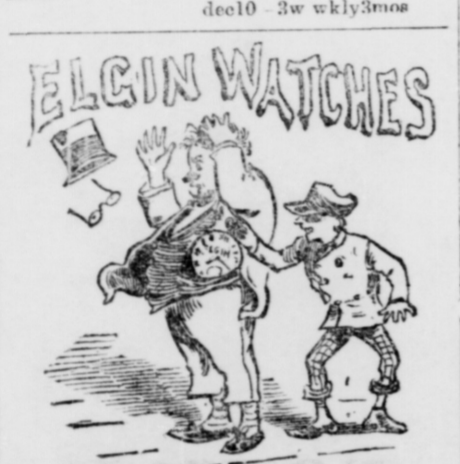

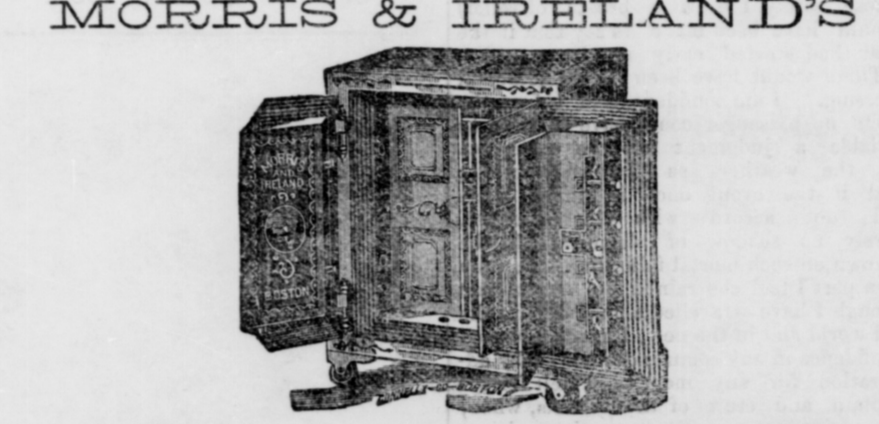

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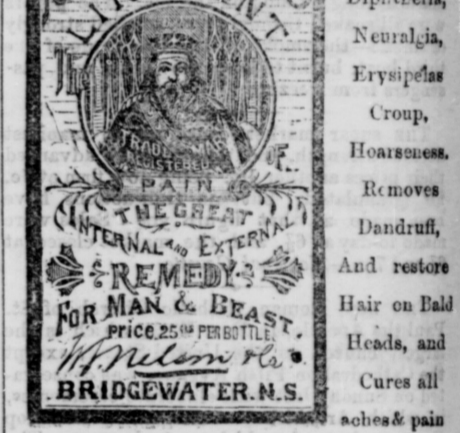
