The Official Board of the O'Leary Pastoral Charge of the United Church of Canada met for their regular quarterly meeting in the Sunday School room of the O'Leary Church on Thursday afternoon, March 23rd. Representatives were present from O'Leary West Devon and Bloomfield and a report was received from the Brae congregation. The minister, Rev. W. G. Dickson opened the session with prayer and explained about the special service which the P. E. I. Presbytery are planning in Trinity United Church in Charlottetown on June 9th in commemoration of the 25th of Church Union. The Official Board was favorably disposed to the proposal to hire a special bus for this memorable occasion and the Minister was authorized to secure further data and costs of a bus. The Senior Elder, Mr. Arthur J. Matheson of O'Leary then was appointed chairman of the meeting and financial matters were discussed. Mr. Matheson attended the great inaugural service in Toronto on June 10th 1925 when over 10,000 people, representing the former congregations of the Presbyterian, Methodist and Congregational Churches, together with the Local

Union Churches of Western Canada gathered, and the United Church of Canada was born. Mr. Matheson is planning to attend the Maritime Conference in Sackville, N. B. on June 13th this year when special emphasis will be given to the 25th Anniversary of Church Union.
