Society Handled 4 New Cases

Since November the Prince County Council of the John Howard Society has handled four new cases as well as an additional five cases.

Ernest Murphy, vice-president in his report to a meeting of directors last night stated these cases represent one who was paroled for supervision, three who have applied for parole and requested assistance, one time expired case to be returned to the community, one juvenile charged in court with murder and three other miscellaneous cases.

Material assistance has been provided for three of these cases and other forms of assistance for the other six, said Mr. Murphy, who expressed appreciation to workers in the Prince County area who have carried on the work of the council in "a commendable manner."

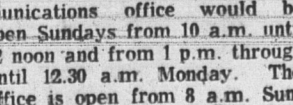
