Toronto - Market down; extremely heavy trading.
New York - Market irregularly higher; rails decline.
Montreal - Market narrowly mixed; fairly active trading.
NEW YORK (AP) - The threat of a U.S.-wide railway strike sent rail shares down sharply Wednesday but the rest of the stock list showed enough selective strength to give the market an irregular advance on balance. Trading was active.
In late trading Chrysler was bought heavily and advanced 2 1/2 to 4 1/4 to bolster the average. Its turnover of 125,400 shares made it the most active stock.
Woolworth, which earlier had proposed a 3-for-1 stock split, also was heavily traded and rose 3/4 to 8 1/4.
Airlines rallied as a group, but the level of recent days. Industrials handled 218,200 shares and mines and oils 1,013,200 shares.
Papers were off 0.9 to 13 1/2 with Fraser dropping 1/4 to 31 1/2 and Great Lakes advancing 1/4 to 23. Industrials dipped 0.3 to 14 1/4 as Canada Cement slid 1/4 to 42 1/2 and Southern climbed 1/4 to 28 1/2.

MONTREAL (CP) - Prices underwent a decline early Wednesday but had almost recovered at the close of the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges. The composite index fell 1/4 to 130 1/2 and declines led advances 96 to 74.
Trading was fairly active but not up to the level of recent days. Industrials handled 218,200 shares and mines and oils 1,013,200 shares.
Papers were off 0.9 to 13 1/2 with Fraser dropping 1/4 to 31 1/2 and Great Lakes advancing 1/4 to 23. Industrials dipped 0.3 to 14 1/4 as Canada Cement slid 1/4 to 42 1/2 and Southern climbed 1/4 to 28 1/2.
