# Supreme Court Rules Griffith To Lose Title

NEW YORK (AP) — Supreme Court Justice Samuel M. Gold upheld Monday the New York Athletic Commission rule which would bar Emilie Griffith from holding both the middleweight and welterweight boxing titles. Griffith had attacked the commission's rule which limits a professional boxer to holding only one championship at one time. He claimed the regulations deprived him of a valuable property right and was in conflict with the state and federal constitutions.

The 29-year-old king of the 145-pound division dethroned Dick Tiger as ruler of the 160-pound middleweight class last April.

# Cape Breton Boxer To Battle Tonight

By JOHN SHORT EDMONTON (CP)—A training ring, interrupted by a family fight and plans for a wedding, ended Monday for Bill McGrandie of Edmonton, who defends his Canadian featherweight boxing championship tonight against former champion Rocky McDougall of Sydney, N.S.

McGrandie took the title from McDougall on a unanimous decision in June. He decked his rival twice in the third round but couldn't keep him down.

McDougall, tall for a featherweight at 5-foot 8 inches, said in an interview he will not attempt to punch it out with McGrandie, who is scheduled to get married Wednesday.

McDougall, a second-year university student, won the championship by knocking out Marcel Bellefeuille of Montreal.

Promoter Nick Zubray said neither fighter is obligated to a third meeting, but he is prepared to stage another bout late in August.

Calling that, he said, he hopes to match the winner with Richie Soof of Portland, Ore., fifth-ranked featherweight in the world.

This will be the third professional fight for McGrandie, who turned 19 shortly after winning the title. The blonde youngster had an impressive amateur career of about 150 fights.

McDougall, 22, had no amateur fights but has fought 27 times as a pro.

# George Chuvalo Inks Fight Pact

MONTREAL (CP) — George Chuvalo, Canadian heavyweight champion, has signed with Montreal promoter Johnny Rougeau for a 10-round bout against Mel Thornhill of Paterson, N.J., here Tuesday, Aug. 16. Rougeau announced Monday.

Chuvalo is no stranger to Montreal rings, having fought former champion Robert Cleroux here twice for the title, in addition to their appearance in Toronto. Cleroux held the title when he retired with a 2-1 edge over Chuvalo.

Since that time Chuvalo has had five bouts with world champion Cassius Clay and the World Boxing Association titlist, Ernie Terrell of Chicago.

Thornhill acted as sparring partner to Clay for his Chuvalo fight and previously worked out with Sonny Liston.

# Bombers To Meet Eskimos In Western Match Tonight

By WALTER KREVENCHUK WINNIPEG (CP)—Leo Lewis has churned out 10.4 miles in offensive yardage for Winnipeg Blue Bombers in 10 Western Football Conference seasons.

The halfback from a little college in Lincoln, Mo., heads for the 20,000-yard plateau in his 11th campaign, which opens tonight against Edmonton Eskimos.

Lewis had 18,359 yards to his credit prior to the 3 p.m. CDT kickoff. Included were 8,733 yards on 1,320 rushes and 4,192 yards on 230 pass receptions.

Age and injury—he had a knee operation during the off-season—may have reduced the potency of his charge but the 32-year-old Lewis doesn't have to run to be a threat. He has thrown 14 touchdown strikes from Bombers' halfback-pass pattern.

Eskimos will have to patch their pass defence, shredded by touchdown passes in a 40-13 tumble before Saskatchewan Roughriders in the 1966 WFC opener Friday night.

CHOICE RECEIVERS Bomber quarterback Kenny Ploen has choice receivers in Farley Funston, Ken Nielsen, Dave Raimy and Billy Cooper. Edmonton coach Neil Arnstrong should remember Raimy. The import halfback grabbed the opening WFC kickoff last season in Edmonton and romped 105 yards for a touchdown en route to a 21-14 Winnipeg win.

Bud Grant, Bomber coach-general manager said: "People are going to be deceived if they think the Eskimos will have 40 points scored against them every game. They're not that bad a football team."

Grant, who guided Bombers from last place in 1964 to the Grey Cup final in 1965, said Edmonton suffered from a severe case of Hugh Campbell, Eskimos' comparatively green secondary provided a paradise for the Roughrider flanker who caught three touchdown passes.

BETTER PASS DEFENCE Grant said Eskimos' pass defence is already better than last year, when Edmonton finished in last place. He cited John Wydarney, an off-season trade acquisition from Toronto Argonauts as the chief reason.

Grant intends to use Eskimo castoff Billy Martin to return punts. Bill Restell, rookie import from the University of Iowa, will attempt to fill the guard position left vacant by the retirement of Herb Gray.

Armstrong plans two inserts into his defensive unit. Jim Stinette, in his seventh season of professional duty, moves to linebacker and Tommy Thomson, a Canadian, to halfback.

"We just hope to get a better effort out of everybody," said Armstrong, thinking about the four crucial games Eskimos play in the first 15 days of the 1966 season.
