WINTER SHIPMENT AT ST. JOHN

From the opening of the season in December until the end of February, thirty steamships, exclusive of the Furness liners, which have not carried much western goods this winter, have sailed from St. John with full cargoes for British ports.

This is the third season of St. John winter port trade. In the season of 1895-6, the total of this trade was less than \$3,000,000. In the whole of the season of 1896-97 there were forty-six cargoes cleared, and if we average them at a value of \$100,000 each, which would probably be above the mark, the total value would be \$4,600,000.
