

Wrestling Bear Ginger Dies

BARRIE, Ont. (CP) — Ginger, one of the few wrestling bears in the world, died Tuesday of a heart attack in this Lake Simcoe town. The 500 - pound black Alaska bear was about to appear on a TV interview. Just 60 seconds before the interview was scheduled to take place, Ginger, who was playing with her owner, wrestler Pat Malone of Nashville, Tenn., rolled over, groaned, and died.

Sportscaster Bill Bennett, told of the bear's death as the program went on the air, quickly explained to his audience the interview had been cancelled and ad libbed a few sports items to fill the program.

Also cancelled was a wrestling bout scheduled for last night between Ginger and wrestler Carl Kowalski.

Malone, who spent five years training the bear, said he would give up bear wrestling.

Mr. Nelson Myers, a graduate of Tignish High School with the class of 1957 is at present attending teacher training classes at Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown.

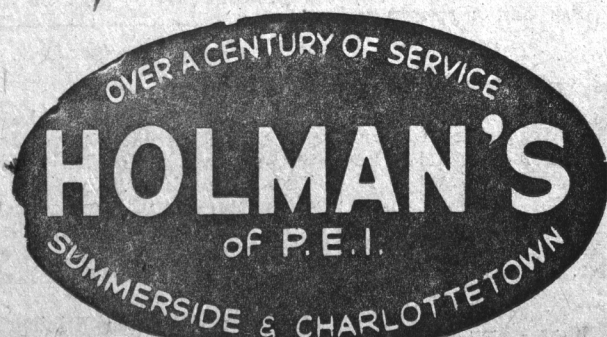
Mrs. Mary McNally, who spent the past nine months in New York and Florida, has come to spend the summer at her home "The Maples" in Tignish.

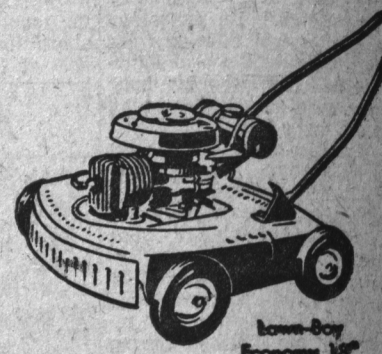

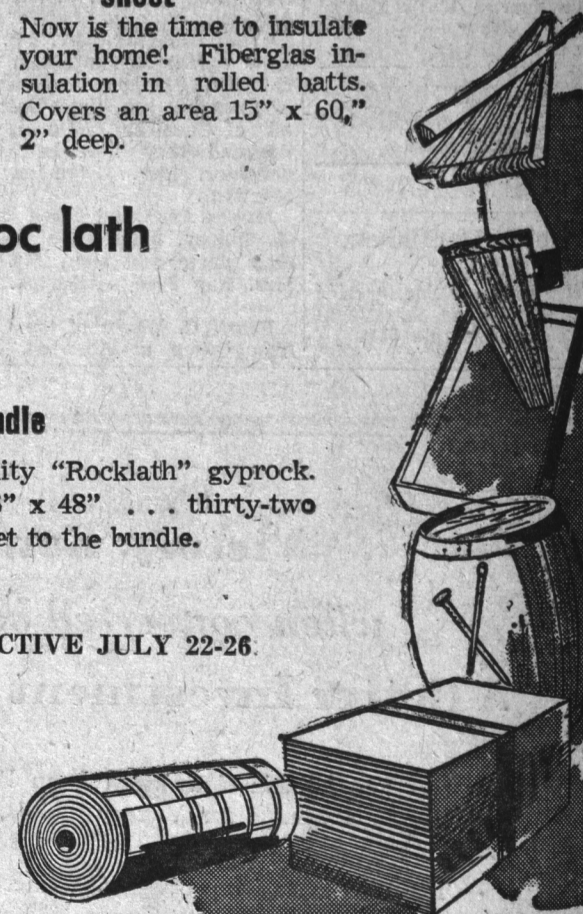
