"No single element has done more in the development of the economy of Canada than the farmer," Mr. Cullen said, as he described the drop in the farm force between 1901 and the present time. "Approximately half a million farmers and hired men are now keeping step in producing the farm elements required by Canada, regardless of the greatly increased population. In the transition period from horses to machinery, the Canadian farmer has met the impact of a complete revolution, and has dealt with it successfully," the Minister said.
